fore-mentioned in this Act; which the faid Sheriffs respectively are herey required and obliged by Virtue of their Office to receive, as well as collect and receive all Fines and Forfeitures arising on the Breach of ny Part of this Act by such Ordinary-keepers; for receiving, collecting, and paying of which Fines and Forfeitures, the said Sheriffs shall be alwed a Salary of five Pounds per Cent. And that the Clerk of each petive County shall keep a true and exact Entry of all Ordinary-keeers, to whom such Licenses are granted, and of all Fines and Forseitures elating thereto; and at every November Court shall deliver to the Jusces a true List of all Ordinary-keepers in their respective Counties licened as aforefaid; as also of all Fines and Forteitures happening in that rear; and shall also cause to be delivered the like List or Account to the Commissioners or Trustees for emitting Bills of Credit, on or before the wenty-fifth Diy of December, yearly: And the faid several and respecive Sheriffs are hereby obliged and required to pay all fuch Sum or Sums of Money as shall come to their Hands by Virtue of this Act, for Ordinay Licentes, or Fines and Forfeitures, as aforelaid, to the Commissioners or Trustees aforetaid, on or before the last Day of April, every Year duing the Continuance of this Act, to be by the faid Commission or Trustees applied to the replacing the aforefaid Sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, so as aforelaid taken out and applied: For which said License and Recognizance to keep good Rules and Order, as is herefter directed, every Ordinary-keeper shall pay to the Clerk of each respective County Court the Sum of three Shillings, and no more.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority eforesaid, That the Justices of the leveral County Courts be and are hereby authorized and impowered, at their several County Courts in the Month of August yearly, or oftner as they shall think fit, to let and assets the Rates and Prices of all I iquors and other Accommodations whattoever, in Current Money of this Province, by them the faid Ordinary-keepers to be vended for the Year entuing, and to yearly and every Year; which Rates and Prices of all Liquors and other Accommodations, so to be set and affessed, limitted and appointed, by the Justices aforesaid, shall be by their several and respective Clerks transcribed and set up at the several and respective County Courts, in some public Places there, that every Person may peruse the same; the Copy of which Table of Prices of Liquors and Accomm dations every Ordinary-keeper within each County is hereby obliged to keep tup in the most public and convenient Place of their Houses for the gerulal of such Persons as receive any Ordinary Accommodations, under he Penalty of Five Pounds Current Money, to be collected, paid, and pplied as aforelaid; and on Non-Payment thereof, to be fued for in his Lordship's Name, by Bill, Plaint, or Information; or upon the Presentment of any Grand Jury, without the Formality of an Indictment; for Which Table of Prices every Ordinary-keeper shall pay to such Clerk, the Sum of Two Shillings like Money, and no more: And every Ordinarykeeper or lunholder, who shall after the Assessing and setting up the Rates

Prices of Liquors and other Accommodations to be fet up in all Ordinaries.
