other Package of Tobacco, stamped with a forged or counterfeit Stamps, or deinand Tobacco of any Inspector upon any such lorged or counterfeited Note or Receipt, knowing such Note or Receipt, or such Stamp to be forged or counterfeited; or shall put or pack into any Hogshead, Cask, or Cate of Tobacco, stamped by any Inspector, any Tobacco whatsoever, or shall draw or take out any Stave, Plank, or Heading-board of any Hog. head, Cak, or Cale of Tobacco, after such Hogshead, Cask, or Case of Tobacco shall be delivered out from any of the public Warehouses aforesaid; every Person to offending, and being thereof convicted by due Courle of Law, shall be adjudged a Felon, and shall fuffer as in

Case of Felony.

And be it further Enasted by the Authority aforesaid, That if any I spec- Of Notes loft, tors Notes or Receipts be calually loft, millaid, or destroyed, the Person or Per-Jons intitled to receive the Tobacco by Virtue of any such Note or Receipt, shall make Oath, or Affirmation it a Quaker, before a Justice of the Peace of the County where the same is payable, to the Number or Date of every such Note or Receipt, to whom and where payable, and for what Quantity of Tobacco the same was given, and that such Note or Receipt is lost, mislaid, or destroyed, and that he, she, or they, at the time such Note or Receipt was lost, nissun, or destroyed, was lawfully intitled to acceive the Tobecco therein mentioned; and shall take a Certificate thereof from such Justice: And upon producing a Contificate of such Oath or A firmation to the Inspectors who signed such Note or weceipt, and lodging the same with them, the said Inspectors shall, and are hereby directed to pay and deliver to the Person obtaining such Cestificare, the Tobacco for which any such Notes or Receipts were given (if the lam , or any Part thereof, shall not have been before by them paid, by Virtue of the faid Notes of Receipts), and shall be thereby discharged from all Actions, Suits, and Demands, on Account of such Notes or Receipts. And if any Person shall be convicted of making a falle Oath or Affirmation, or producing a forged Certific te, in the Case aforestaid, he shall torfeit and pay thirty Shillings for every hundred Pounds Weight of Tobacco contained in such Certificate, and so in Proportion for a Just Quantity; and moreover, upon Conviction in any Court of Record, shall suffer as in Case of wilful and corrupt Perjury.

And be it further Enacio d by the Authority aforesaid, That all Tobacco duc, or to grow due and payable, for Public and County Levizs, Parochial Charges, and all Officers and Attorneys Fees, which shall not be discharged and paid in Money, as by the Paper-Currency Act, or this Act, is directed, the Allowance to the Clargy hereby lettled shall be paid and discharged in the following Manner; That is to fay, The Public and County Levies, in any of the Warehouses within the County on which the same shall be levied; Parochial Charges, and the Allowance to the Clergy; in some Warehouse within that Parish, it required; and all Officers and Attorneys Fees, in some of the Warehouses within the County where the Person shall live to whom the same shall be chargeable: And should there happen to be any County or Parish without a Warehouse, that then and in fuch Cate, all the aforesaid Public and County Levies, Parochial Charg s, Officers and Attorneys Fees, or such Part thereof as shall notabe paid in Money, and Clergy's Allowance, shall be paid by Inspectors Notes, at some Warehouse or Warehouses in the next adjacent Counties. Provided always, That no

Transfer Notes of the preceding Year shall pass in any such Payment.

And be it Enacted, That at the time of laving any Public or County Levies, there shall be levied for the Sheriff that is to collect and pay the fame, fix Pounds per Centum, and no more; which the faid Sheriff is hereby impowered to retain in his own Hands.

And in Regard that it is the general Expectation, that by Means of this Act. Tobacco will be meliorated, the Quantity undoubtedly lessened, and the Mode of Payment much facilitated, and thereby the Stipends of the Clergy will be made more valuable than at present; and that it is deemed but highly reaionable, that, in Regard this Province will be at an Expende in carrying this Act into Execution, in which the Clergy ought to bear a Part: Be it motted, That during the Continuance of this Act, the County Courts levy on the tax-
