or may happen as aforesaid, to succeed any Inspector or Inspectors, as aforesaid religning, refusing, removed, or dead: But should it so happen, that by Deaths, Refignations, Refusals, or Removals, there should not be Persons enough lest in the Nominations of the respective Vestry-men and Church-wardens, to as a. foresaid to be transmitted for the Appointment of the Governor or Commander in Chief, then, and in such Case, the Vestry-men and Church-wardens of any Parish or Parishes, where this shall happen to be the Case, shall immediately meet as aforesaid, and elect two, or four, as the Case shall require, for Inspectors, and, as before, transmit them to the Clerk of the Council, to be, as before, laid by him before the Governor or Commander in Chef, out of which the faid Governor or Commander in Chief shall appoint a sufficient Number, according to the true intent and meaning of this Act, to serve as Inspectors respectively, according and in pursuance of the Recommendations aforesaid from the respective Vestry-men and Church-wardens. Provided always, and it is the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, that though the Vestry-men and Church-wardens are to elect Inspectors annually, yet where they elect again a former Inspector or Inspectors, they shall continue such without any new Appointment, by the Governor or Commander in Chief.

Vestrymen or Church-wardens not to resuse the Nomination of Inspectors. And be it further Enacted, That every Vestry-man or Church-warden, who shall neglect or resulte (not being prevented by Sickness or some unavoidable Accident) to meet according to the directions of this Act, to nominate and recommend an Inspector or Inspectors, or who being so met, shall omit, neglect, or resulte to nominate and recommend an Inspector or Inspectors, whereby Inspectors shall not be nominated and recommended in pursuance of this Act, shall forseit and pay five Pounds Current Money for every such Offence, one moiety to the Insormer, the other moiety to the uses in this Act mentioned, and to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Insormation, wherein no Essoin, Protection, or Wager of Law, shall be allowed.

Proviso.

Provided always, That no Vestry-man or Church-warden, who shall be an Inspector, or who shall be nominated or recommended to be one, shall have or be allowed, so long as he shall be an Inspector, any Vote in the Nomination or Recommendation of any other Inspector or Inspectors; and that where any Person or Persons shall be appointed in pursuance of such Nomination and Recommendation as already mentioned, and shall afterwards and again be nominated and recommended to be an Inspector or Inspectors for the ensuing Year, such Nomination and Recommendation shall be a sufficient Power to such Inspector or Inspectors to be and continue in the said Office, without any surther Appointment; and so, from Year to Year, so long as he or they shall be nominated and recommended as aforesaid.

Oath to be taken by Veftrymen and Church-wardens

And be it further Enacted, That every Vestry-man and Church-warden, shall take the following Oath before they proceed to the Nomination or Recommendation of any Inspector or Inspectors, to wit, I A. B. do Swear, that I will faithfully, honestly and justly, nominate and recommend such Person or Persons to be an inspector or inspectors, as I think in my Judgment and Conscience is or are fit and capable to execute the Office of an Inspector or Inspectors. So help me God.

Sheriffs to receive a Certificate of the Nomination of Inspectors.

And be it further Enacted, That notwithstanding any thing in this Act, it shall be the Duty of the Sheriffs within this Province to receive from the Vestrymen and Church-wardens, or their Register, a Certificate of the Nominations or Recommendations of any Inspector or Inspectors, provided the same be delivered to the Sheriff or his Deputy within six Davs after such Nomination and Recommendation; and that such Sheriff or Sheriffs shall cause such Nominations or Recommendations to be transmitted in the same Manner as other public Letters are or ought to be dispatched, directed to the Clerk of the Council; and that such Letters be indorsed for his Lordship's Service.

Concerning the Owners of Lands where the Warehoufes are to be built.

And be it Enacted by the Authority aforefaid. That the Justices of each refpective County within this Province shall, with all possible Speed, make Enquiry who are the Proprietors or Owners of the Ground, whereon the Warehouse or Warehouses within the respective Parishes are directed to be built; and then direct their Clerk to issue a Note in Writing, to the Sheriss of the respective
