

or may happen as aforesaid, to succeed any Inspector or Inspectors, as aforesaid resigning, refusing, removed, or dead: But should it so happen, that by Deaths, Resignations, Refusals, or Removals, there should not be Persons enough left in the Nominations of the respective Vestry-men and Church-wardens, so as aforesaid to be transmitted for the Appointment of the Governor or Commander in Chief, then, and in such Case, the Vestry-men and Church-wardens of any Parish or Parishes, where this shall happen to be the Case, shall immediately meet as aforesaid, and elect two, or four, as the Case shall require, for Inspectors, and, as before, transmit them to the Clerk of the Council, to be, as before, laid by him before the Governor or Commander in Chief, out of which the said Governor or Commander in Chief shall appoint a sufficient Number, according to the true intent and meaning of this Act, to serve as Inspectors respectively, according and in pursuance of the Recommendations aforesaid from the respective Vestry-men and Church-wardens. *Provided always*, and it is the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, that though the Vestry-men and Church-wardens are to elect Inspectors annually, yet where they elect again a former Inspector or Inspectors, they shall continue such without any new Appointment, by the Governor or Commander in Chief.

Vestrymen or Church-wardens not to refuse the Nomination of Inspectors.

*And be it further Enacted*, That every Vestry-man or Church-warden, who shall neglect or refuse (not being prevented by Sickneſs or ſome unavoidable Accident) to meet according to the directions of this Act, to nominate and recommend an Inspector or Inspectors, or who being ſo met, shall omit, neglect, or refuse to nominate and recommend an Inspector or Inspectors, whereby Inspectors shall not be nominated and recommended in pursuance of this Act, shall forfeit and pay five Pounds Current Money for every ſuch Offence, one moiety to the Informer, the other moiety to the uſes in this Act mentioned, and to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Complaint, or Information, wherein no Eſſoin, Protection, or Wager of Law, shall be allowed.

Proviso.

*Provided always*, That no Vestry-man or Church-warden, who shall be an Inspector, or who shall be nominated or recommended to be one, shall have or be allowed, ſo long as he shall be an Inspector, any Vote in the Nomination or Recommendation of any other Inspector or Inspectors; and that where any Person or Persons shall be appointed in pursuance of ſuch Nomination and Recommendation as already mentioned; and shall afterwards and again be nominated and recommended to be an Inspector or Inspectors for the enſuing Year, ſuch Nomination and Recommendation shall be a ſufficient Power to ſuch Inspector or Inspectors to be and continue in the ſaid Office, without any further Appointment; and ſo, from Year to Year, ſo long as he or they shall be nominated and recommended as aforesaid.

Oath to be taken by Vestrymen and Church-wardens.

*And be it further Enacted*, That every Vestry-man and Church-warden, shall take the following Oath before they proceed to the Nomination or Recommendation of any Inspector or Inspectors, to wit, *I A. B. do Swear, that I will faithfully, honestly and juſtly, nominate and recommend ſuch Perſon or Perſons to be an Inspector or Inspectors, as I think in my Judgment and Conſcience is or are fit and capable to execute the Office of an Inspector or Inspectors. So help me God.*

Sheriffs to receive a Certificate of the Nomination of Inspectors.

*And be it further Enacted*, That notwithstanding any thing in this Act, it shall be the Duty of the Sheriffs within this Province to receive from the Vestry-men and Church-wardens, or their Register, a Certificate of the Nominations or Recommendations of any Inspector or Inspectors, provided the ſame be delivered to the Sheriff or his Deputy within ſix Days after ſuch Nomination and Recommendation; and that ſuch Sheriff or Sheriffs shall cauſe ſuch Nominations or Recommendations to be transmitted in the ſame Manner as other public Letters are or ought to be diſpatched, directed to the Clerk of the Council; and that ſuch Letters be indorſed for his Lordſhip's Service.

Concerning the Owners of Lands where the Warehouſes are to be built.

*And be it Enacted by the Authority aforesaid*, That the Juſtices of each reſpective County within this Province shall, with all poſſible Speed, make Enquiry who are the Proprietors or Owners of the Ground, whereon the Warehouse or Warehouſes within the reſpective Parishes are directed to be built; and then direct their Clerk to iſſue a Note in Writing, to the Sheriff of the reſpective County,
