Acts of Assembly passed in March, 1762.

An Act to augment the Salaries of the Inspectors at Elk-Ridge Landing Warehouse, in Anne-Arundel County, and the Inspectors of Emerson's Warehouse in Talbot County, and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

Preamble.

HEREAS the Salaries allowed to the Inspectors at Elk-Ridge Landing Warehouse, in Anne. Arundel County, and to the Inspectors at Emerson's Warehouse, in Talbot County, by the Act, entituled, An Act for amending the Staple of Tobacco, for preventing Frauds in his Majesty's Customs, and for the Limitation of Officers Fees, are too small and inadequate to their Care and Trouble in their Office of Inspectors:

II. BE it therefore Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Confent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That for this present Year, and every suture Year during the Continuance of the said Act, there shall be spectors Salaries, allowed and paid to each of the Inspectors at Elk-Ridge Landing, and the Inspectors of Emerson's Warehouses, aforesaid, the Sum of Ten Pounds to each Inspector, over and above the Salaries allowed to the Inspectors at the said Warehouses, by the Act aforesaid; which said Sum of Ten Pounds, to each of the Inspectors aforesaid, shall be allowed and paid, in the same Manner as Inspectors Salaries are payable

III. AND whereas it has been represented to this General Assembly, That the Allowance to the In51. to the In-spector of Broad-Creek Warehouse, in Worcester County, for the preceding Year, has not been equal to his spector at Broad- Trouble and Care: Be it likewife Enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the Justices of Worcester County Court, to levy on the taxable Inhabitants of their County, for the Use of the Inspector of Broad-Creek Warehouse, a Sum of Money not exceeding Five Pounds Current Money to the said Inspector, over and above his Salary settled and allowed by the aforesaid recited Act, for his Extraordinary Service, in attending at the aforesaid Warehouse, in the Year Seventeen Hundred and Sixty.

An Act for Building a Church in Saint James's Parish in Anne-Arundel County.

Preamble.

*HEREAS by Petition to this General Assembly, from the Vestry-men, Church-wardens, and the Parishioners of Saint James's Parish in Anne-Arundel County, it is represented, That their Parish Church is so much decayed, that it is irrepairable, and it is prayed that an Act of Assembly may pass, impowering the Justices of the said County to Levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of the said Parish, the Quantity of One Hundred and Thirty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, at Two even and equal Assessments, to be applied towards the Building of the faid Church:

A new Church to be built in St. James's Parish.

II. BE it therefore Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Confent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That the Vestry-men and Church-wardens of Saint James's Parish in Anne-Arundel County, or the Majority of them, shall, and they are hereby obliged and required, as soon as conveniently may be, to contract and agree for the building and compleatly finishing a new Church, on or near the Place where the Parish Church of the said Parish now stands.

III. AND be it further Enacted, That the Justices of Anne-Arundel County Court shall, and they are 130,000 Wt. of hereby required, on Application to them made by the Vestry-men and Church-wardens, or the Majority of Tobacco to be them, to Levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of the faid Books. them, to Levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of the said Parish, by Two even and equal Assessments, in the Two next ensuing Years, the aforesaid Quantity of One Hundred and Thirty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, together with a Salary to the Sheriff of the said County for collecting the same of Five fer Centum; and the said Sheriff is hereby directed and impowered to collect, account for, and pay the same, to the said Vestrymen and Church-wardens, in the same Manner as other Tobacco Levies are collected, accounted for, and paid; to be applied by the said Vestry-men and Church-wardens, or the Majority of them, to the building and compleatly finishing the said new Church, and to no other Purpose whatsoever.
