

# Acts of Assembly passed in *March*, 1762.

IV. *AND be it likewise Enacted*, That every Person who is obliged to kill any Number of Squirre's or Crows by this Act, or that shall be entitled to any Bounty for killing Squirrels or Crows by this Act, he, she, or they, or some other credible Person, shall make Oath (or Affirmation if a Quaker) before some Magistrate, That such Squirrels or Crows were killed in the said County of *Baltimore*; any Law to the contrary, in any wise, notwithstanding.

Persons entitled to the Bounty, &c. to make Oath, &c.

V. *PROVIDED always*, That it shall and may be lawful for the severall and respective Inhabitants within this Province, to pay and discharge the said severall and respective Quantities of Tobacco, so to be levied and raised, to and for the Uses aforesaid, in Current Money, in the same Manner as they are enabled to pay and discharge the Public or County Levy.

Proviso.

VI. *THIS Act* to be in Force for and during the Term of Three Years, and unto the End of the next Session of Assembly which shall happen after the Expiration of the said Three Years.
