and in such Case, the Plaintiff or Plaintiffs, shall be Nonsuit, and pay the CHAP. Defendant's Costs; and in case any Plaintiff or Plaintiffs shall refuse to submit to such Examination, such Resusal shall be deemed and taken to be a. Confession or Proof of the Fact.

LXXV. And be it likewise Enasted, That if any Plaintiff in any such Punishment Case, shall knowingly Swear or Affirm falsly, and be thereof convict, he, for false they shall suffer as in case of willful hard sometime. the, or they, shall suffer as in case of wilful and corrupt Perjury.

LXXVI. Provided always, and it is the true Intent and Meaning of this Contract for Act, That nothing therein contained shall extend or be construed to extend, to Tobacco in vacate or abolish any Contract, Bargain, or Agreement, made for the Pay- Specie. ment of Tobacco in Specie, before the said Sixteenth Day of May, Seventeen Hundred and Forty-seven; but that such Bargain, Contract, or Agreement, shall be and remain in full Force and Effect; any Thing in this Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

LXXVII. And be it further Enacted, That all Bonds (with Power of At-Judgment torney to confess Judgment), taken for Money in lieu of Tobacco, between Bonds taken the Fifteenth Day of May, Seventeen Hundred and Forty-seven, and the First lieu of To-Day of December, Seventeen Hundred and Forty-eight, shall be and are here-bacco. by made void and of no Effect: And it shall not be lawful for any Justices of any Court within this Province, to render or give Judgment on such Bonds, by virtue of such Power of Attorney; and no Clerk or Clerks of any Court or Courts, within this Province, shall issue or make out any Execution, upon such Judgment. And that during the Continuance of this Act, no Judgments shall be entered on any Judgment Bonds for Money, taken after the Fifteenth Day of May, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Forty-seven, until the Court, Judge, or Justice, before whom a Judgment is or shall be offered to be entered up, be satisfied, that the Desendant or Desendants, is or are actually run away; nor even then, unless the Plaintiff or his Attorney in Fact, or one acquainted with the Transaction, makes Oath, that the Bond was not passed for a Tobacco Debt, contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this, or the aforesaid other recited Act.

LXXVIII. And, whereas the excessive Quantity of Tobacco made, may, Encouragein some Measure, depreciate that Branch of Trade: In order therefore to ment for Perform fons not makencourage the manufacturing of Hemp, Flax, and other proper Materials, ing Tobacco. for the necessary Cloathing and Use of his Majesty's Subjects within this Province, and to divert Part of the People from labouring in Tobacco; Be it Enacted by the Authority, Advice and Consent aforefuid, That from and after the End of this Session of Assembly, it shall and may be lawful for any Perfon or Persons, not making Tobacco by themselves, Servants or Slaves, within this Province, to pay, at or before the Tenth Day of April yearly, or as the Business, or Services, they may want in any of the Offices, shall be done, To pay off during the Continuance of this Act, as well the Poll Tax due to the Clergy, Taxes and Fees, in Gold as all Lawyers, and Officers Fees, and Assessments for building of repairing and Silver, as Churches, in Gold and Silver, as regulated by this Act; and that such Pay regulated by ment, or Tender thereof, and Refusal, shall be a full Satisfaction and Dis-this Act. charge for the same, though charged in Tobacco; any Law, Statute, Usage, or Custom, or any thing contained in this Act, to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding.

LXXIX. Provided always, That every Person or Persons allowed by this To be sworn Act to pay Gold and Silver instead of Tobacco due as aforesaid, shall make that they Oath, or Affirmation if a Quaker, That he did not, in the Year preceding, by bacco for bimself, or by his Children, Servants, or Slaves, make any Tobacco for Sale.
