

V. And whereas at the Time of the Division of the said County of *Somerset*, there was in the Hands of *James Hollyday*, Esq; Deceased, late Treasurer of the Eastern Shore, sundry Sums of Money due to *Somerset* County School, which still remains in the Hands of *James Hollyday*, Esq; his Executor, one Moiety of which, ought in Equity and Conscience, to be applied to the Use of *Worcester* County School; Be it therefore Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the said Visitors of *Worcester* County School, for the Time being, or the major Part of them, shall and are hereby impowered and directed to receive from the said *James Hollyday*, Esq; the Executor, the one Moiety of all such Sum and Sums of Money, which at the Time of the Division of the County of *Somerset*, were in the Hands of the said late Treasurer, due to *Somerset* County School; and the said *James Hollyday*, Esq; is hereby authorised, impowered and directed, to pay the same to the Visitors of *Worcester* County School, for the Time being, or the major Part of them, or their Order or Orders, for the Use of *Worcester* County School.

C H A P. XX.

An ACT to enable the Rector, Vestry-men, and Church-wardens of the Parish of *St. Margaret's Westminster*, in *Anne-Arundel* County, for the Time being, to sell a Tract of Land therein mentioned, and to apply the Produce Money arising by such Sale, towards the Purchase of another Piece of Land to be made a Glebe, for the Use of the Incumbent of that Parish, and his Successors. Ditto.

WHEREAS the Rector, Vestry-men, Church-wardens, and sundry of the principal Inhabitants and Freeholders, of the Parish of *St. Margaret's Westminster*, in *Anne-Arundel* County, by their humble Petition to this General Assembly, have set forth, That they, in Right of the Parish, are seised of a Tract or Parcel of Land, originally Granted to a certain *William Fuller*, for One Hundred and Fifty Acres, and now commonly known by the Name of *Whitehall*, lying in an extreme Part of the said Parish, near a Place called *Sandy-Point*; and have, by reason of the very inconvenient Situation of the said Land, humbly prayed, that an Act may pass to enable them, the said Rector, Vestry-men, and Church-wardens, to Sell the said Land at any Sum not less than Three Hundred Pounds Sterling, and to apply the Produce Money arising by such Sale, towards the Purchase of another Piece of Land, in a more central Part of the Parish, to be made a Glebe, for the Use of the Incumbent of the said Parish, and his Successors: Which, being by this General Assembly thought reasonable, it is prayed that it may be Enacted, Preamble.

II. And be it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That the Vestry-men and Church-wardens of the Parish of *St. Margaret's Westminster*, in *Anne-Arundel* County, for the Time being, or the major Part of them, be, and are hereby authorised and impowered, to sell and dispose of, and Convey in Fee-simple, to the Person that shall bid the highest Price, and not under Three Hundred Pounds Sterling, for the aforesaid Tract or Parcel of Land, within Twelve Months from the End of this present Session of Assembly, at Public Vendue, giving Some Glebe Land to be sold, and some other purchased in its stead, more central.
