Be it Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by All Common and with the Advice and Confent of his Lordship's Governor, and the Upper Recoveries heretofore and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That all Com- suffered to mon Recoveries heretofore suffered in the Provincial Court of this Province, be good in by Consent and Agreement of the Parties thereto, shall be good and available in Law to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, to dock and cut off any Estate Tail in any of the Parties thereto, and bar the Issue in Tail, who can, could, or might claim, as Heir of the Body or Bodies of any of the Parties thereto, and also to bar those in Reversion or Remainder, who can, could, or might claim in Default of Issue of the Body or Bodies of any of the Parties to such Recoveries, in the same Manner as if such Recoveries had been legally and formally suffered and executed, notwithstanding the Tenant to the Writ in any such Recovery was not Tenant of the Freehold at the Time of Judgment rendered, or any other Defect in drawing, suffering, or executing any of the said Recoveries: Provided, That some One or more Proviso. of the Parties to fuch Recovery, at the Time of fuch Judgment, was actual Tenant of the Freehold in the Manors, Lands, Tenements or Hereditaments recovered, and the Persons, of some of them joining in such Recovery, had a sufficient Estate and Power to suffer the same.

An ACT to remove a Nusance in Baltimore-Town, in Baltimore County; and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

THEREAS the Inhabitants of Baltimore-Town, in Baltimore Coun- Preamble. ty, have, by their humble Petition to this General Assembly, set forth, That a large Miry Marsh, adjoining the said Town, is, by the noxious Vapours, and putrid Effluvia arifing therefrom, very prejudicial to the Health of its Inhabitants; and that the Proprietors of the said Marsh have, by their Perverseness or Dilatoriness, hitherto refused or neglected to remove the said Nusance, and that the said Nusance cannot be removed otherwise, than by changing the Surface of the said Marsh into firm and dry Ground. And, as the Allegations of the said Petitioners appear to this General Assembly to be true:
