

III. And be it further Enacted, That Messieurs *James Anderson, William Ringgold, William Bordley, Emory Sudler, and James M'Clean*, now dwelling and residing in the said *Chester-Town*, shall be, and are hereby appointed Trustees, and they, or any Three of them, are hereby impowered to contract with proper Workmen, purchase Materials, and carry on and finish the Building, and compleating a good Brick Chapel, Sixty Feet long, Forty Feet wide, and Two Stories high, with a Stone Foundation, on the Ground aforesaid; and the Sheriff of the County aforesaid, is hereby directed and required to pay the Fifty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, by the above recited Act appropriated, to make an Addition to the House of Worship, in the said Town, to the Order or Orders of the said Trustees, or any Two of them; any Thing in the said recited Act to the contrary, notwithstanding. And the said Trustees, or any Three of them, are hereby impowered to receive the said Fifty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, of the said Sheriff, or draw an Order or Orders, for the same, and also to receive the Monies so said to be subscribed, or that shall hereafter be subscribed, towards building the said Chapel, or to sue for, and recover such Monies, in case the Subscribers should neglect or refuse to pay the Sums subscribed by them, respectively; and also to number and dispose of the Pews or Seats that shall be made in the Second Story of the said Chapel, exclusive of a sufficient Common Gallery, and also exclusive of such as may be wanted in the Second Story, to accommodate the Proprietors of the old Church; and the Owners of Lots, and Subscribers to the said new Chapel, as herein after directed, at Public Sale, to the highest Bidder, who shall be a Freeholder of Fifty Acres of Land, at least, within the said Parish, on which some Person or Persons are dwelling, and pay Taxes within the Parish, and which Freeholder shall not have a Pew or Seat in the lower Part of the said Chapel, and receive the Money arising by the Sale of the said Pews; all which Fifty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, Subscription Money, Money arising from the Sale of the said Pews, and the Bricks, and other Materials of the old Church, they shall apply towards the building and finishing the said intended new Chapel.

C H A P.
VIII.
Trustees appointed and impowered to contract with Workmen, and purchase Materials for building the said Chapel, and to receive the Tobacco and Monies appropriated to that Use.

IV. And be it further Enacted, That the said Trustees, shall also cause Pews or Seats to be erected in the lower Part of the said new Chapel, sufficient in Number, and Room, or as near as may be, for the Proprietors of the old Church, to have as good Seats in the new, as they had in the old; and for those Owners of a Lot, or Lots, in the said Town, and Dwellers therein, and others who have subscribed the Sum of Ten Pounds, or upwards, towards the building the said Chapel, to have Seats or Pews therein, also of the same Dimensions; and such others who have subscribed less than Ten Pounds, to have Half Pews, so as Two of such Subscribers may be put into one Draft, and one of them draw; and that when the Pews are erected, they shall be all numbered; except the one *Mr. Thomas Marsh* may choose, he having piously subscribed Seventy Pounds Current Money, on Condition of having his Choice of a Pew in the said Chapel; and, if not enough in the lower Part, to be made up in the second Story, and the several Numbers wrote on so many Pieces of Paper, and put into a Box, and the Names of the several Persons, so entitled to Pews or Seats, whether by Subscription, or otherwise, also wrote on so many Pieces of Paper, and put into another Box, and some indifferent Person to draw out all the Names, and in the Order as the Names rise for the Persons whose Names come up, or some Person by their Direction, to draw out of the Box of Numbers; and the Number each Person draws, shall entitle him, or her, their Heirs, and Assigns, to the Pew or Seat of that Number, and it shall be entered on the Register-Book of the said *Chester* Parish, accordingly, for which Entry, each Owner of a Pew, shall pay the Register One Shilling Current Money; every of the said Persons, Owner of a Lot or Lots, in the said Town, and dwelling therein (and not Proprietors of the old Church) and every Subscriber as aforesaid, towards building the said new Church, first paying, before such

Pews to be erected, and to be disposed of.

The Proprietor of each Pew to have it entered on the Register-Book and such as were not Proprietors in the old Church, to pay the Expence of erecting their Pews &c.
