VIII. And be it further Enacted, That the Justices of the several County The Justices, Courts, shall, at their respective County Courts, in the Month of August, every August, to fix the Rates yearly, or oftener, as they shall think fit, set, and asses, in Current Money, of Liquors, the Rates and Prices of all Liquors, and other Accommodations, what loever, by Ordinary-Keepers to be vended for the Year ensuing; which Rates and Prices of all Liquors, and other Accommodations, so to be set and assessed by the Justices aforesaid, shall be, by their several and respective Clerks, transcribed, and set up, in some Public Place, in their respective County Court-House, that every Person may peruse the same; a Copy of which Rates, every Ordinary-Keeper, within each County, is hereby obliged to keep, and set up, in the most public and convenient Place of his House, for the Perusal of all Persons whatsoever, under the Renalty of Four Pounds Current Money: And every Ordinary-Keeper, who shall directly, or indi- Ordinaryrectly, demand, or receive, for any such Liquors, or other Accommodations, Keepers demore than the Pates and Drices to Mandal that for one feel Demanding more than the Rates and Prices so assessed, shall, for every such Demand, or more; to for-Receipt, forfeit and pay Forty Shillings Current Money. And, in case any in case of suit, Suit is brought by any Ordinary-Keeper, on any Account wherein any Li- to pay Costs, quors, or other Accommodations, are charged higher than the Rates aforesaid, fuch Ordinary-Keeper shall be non-suit, and pay the Defendant his full Costs; and for every such Account paid, and satisfied, to any Ordinary-Keeper, he shall, on Complaint, by the Party injured, to a single Magistrate, or County Court, be, in a summary Way, ordered and compelled, by such Magistrate, or County Court, to restore to the Party injured, the whole Sum, so before had and received, on such Account, with his Cost on such Complaint.

IX. And be it further Enacted, That every Ordinary-Keeper, to be licensed sufficient as aforesaid, shall, within Two Months after obtaining Licence, be obliged bling, &c. to to provide and maintain (if such Ordinary be kept at the Court-House in any be provided, County) Six good Feather-Beds, more than sufficient for the private Use of ty of 10%. fuch Ordinary-Keeper, with sufficient Covering for the same, and Indian Corn, Oats, Hay, Straw, and Stabling for Ten Horses, at least. And, if at any Place in the County, other than the Court-House, Three spare Beds, with Covering, and sufficient Stabling, and Provender for Six Horses, at least, under the Penalty of Ten Pound's Current Money.

X. Provided always, and ha it Enacted, That no Person, so to be licensed, No Ordinary, shall, during the Time of such his keeping Ordinary, be a Delegate, Justice Keeperto hold any Office. of the Peace, or other Officer of the Peace, Attorney, Deputy-Commissary, &c. Clerk, Sheriff, Deputy-Sheriff, Vestryman, Churchwarden, or Juryman, or bear any other Public Office, or Place of Trust, within this Province; nor shall any such Licence be granted to any Person, other than the Master, Principal, or Head of the House, in which such Ordinary shall be kept.

XI. And be it further Enacted, That if any Ordinary-Keeper, shall keep Disorderly a disorderly House, upon Complaint made thereof, to the Justices of the Houses may be suffered fuspended, and
