

spirituous Liquors, mixed or unmixed, such Person, so offending, shall forfeit and pay Five Pounds Current Money. C H A P. XXVII. forfeit 5l.

XIX. And be it further Enacted, That if any Person, other than the Person making such Fair, or setting up such Money, or other Thing, to be contended for, as aforesaid, shall, at any Place of Meeting, for any of the Purposes aforesaid, sell or dispose of any Wine, Rum, Brandy, Cyder, or other strong Liquors, mixed or unmixed, such Person, so offending, shall forfeit and pay Five Pounds Current Money. Other Persons selling spirituous Liquors at such Fair, forfeit the like Sum.

XX. Provided always, That nothing in this Act contained, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prohibit any Person from selling any strong and spirituous Liquors, or any Mixture of the same, at any Fair, authorised and established by Act of Assembly of this Province, Charter, or Bye-Law of any Corporation, or to prohibit any licensed Ordinary-Keeper, from selling strong and spirituous Liquors, or any Mixture thereof, at Horse-Races, for any Sum of Money exceeding Sixteen Pounds Current Money. Proviso, with respect to Fairs established by Act of Assembly, &c. or when a Race shall be for more than 16l.

XXI. Provided nevertheless, and be it Enacted, That it shall not be lawful for any Person, whatsoever, other than a licensed Ordinary-Keeper, to sell, or dispose of, at any such last mentioned Horse-Race, any Wine, Rum, Brandy, Cyder, or other strong Liquors, or any Mixture thereof, under Pain of forfeiting, for every Quantity of the same, sold at one Time, to one or more Persons, Thirty Shillings Current Money. None but licensed Ordinary-Keepers, to sell at such Race, under Penalty of 30s.

XXII. And be it further Enacted, That it shall not be lawful for any Person (except licensed Ordinary-Keepers, at the Time of Horse-Racing, as aforesaid) at any Time to set up, or cause to be set up, a Booth, or other Convenience, on, or near any Public Road, or at any other Place, except where Fairs established by Act of Assembly, Charter, or Bye-Law of any Corporation, are held, and sell or dispose of, thereat, any Wine, Rum, Brandy, Cyder, or other strong Liquors, mixt or unmixt, under the Penalty of Thirty Shillings Current Money, for every Quantity sold at any one Time, to one or more Persons. or allowed to set up Booths, except at Fairs established as above, under the like Penalty.

XXIII. Provided always, and be it Enacted, That it shall not be lawful for any licensed Ordinary-Keeper, to sell or dispose of, after Sun-set, at the Time and Place of Horse-racing aforesaid, any such strong or spirituous Liquors, or mixt Drink, on Pain of forfeiting, for every such Offence, Five Pounds Current Money. Penalty on Ordinary-Keepers selling after Sun set.

XXIV. And be it further Enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the Justices of any County Court, to grant a Licence to any Person to keep an Ordinary, until such Person enter into a Recognizance, in the Name of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of this Province, in the Sum of Forty Pounds Current Money, with Two sufficient Sureties: Conditioned, That if the Person, so obtaining such Licence, shall keep good Rules and Orders, and not suffer loose, idle, or disorderly Persons, to tittle, game, or commit any Disorders, or other Irregularities, in such Ordinary, and shall also well and truly observe, perform, fulfil, and keep the several Matters and Things in this Act particularly specified, and in every respect conform himself thereto, then the said Recognizance to be void, otherwise of Force; for which said Licences, and Recognizances, a Copy of the Rates of Liquors, and other Accommodations, every Ordinary-Keeper shall pay to the Clerk of each respective County Court, the Sum of Four Shillings Current Money, and no more. Licences not to be granted by the County Courts, until the Party enters into a Recognizance, &c.

XXV. And be it Enacted, That no Ordinary-Keeper shall presume to entertain any Sailor or Sailors, or other Person employed in loading of Ships or Vessels, Clerk's Fee, for his Services. Sailors not to be entertained, under Suspension, &c.
