Ordinary-Keepers, entertaining Apprentices, Servants, ar their Maiters, 20 s. recoverable before a trate.

XXVI. And be it further Enaced, That if any Ordinary-Keeper shall harbour, entertain, or tell any Liquor, to any indented Apprentice, or Apprentice bound out by any County Court of this Province, or any bought Slaves, with indented, or convicted Servant, or any Slave belonging to, or employed by any out leave from Person or Persons, within this Province, without Leave or Licence, in Wri-Ec. to forfeit ting, first had and obtained, from the respective Master, Mistress, or Owner of such Apprentice, Servant or Slave, such Ordinary-Keeper shall, for every single Magis- such Offence, forseit and pay Twenty Shillings, to the Master or Mistress of such Apprentice, Servant, or Slave, to be recovered, with Costs, upon Complaint of the faid Master or Mistress, before a Justice of the County, where fuch Ordinary-Keeper lives. and, whereas it is a general Complaint throughout this Province, that Ordinary-Keepers have made it their frequent Practice to game in their own Houses, and to entertain Tradesmen, and other Persons, having Families, and no visible Means of Subsistence, but by their own Labour and Industry, and fingle disorderly Persons, tippling and gaming in their Houses, to the wasting their Time, and Ruin or themselves and Families, and to the evil Example of others: For Prevention of such Evils, for the future; Be it Enacted, That no Person, licensed to keep Ordinary, shall game in his own House, under the Penalty of Ten Pounds Current Money for every such Offence, or shall suffer any Tradesmen, or other Person, having the Penalty of a Family, and no visible Estate, or other Means of Support, than his own Labour and Industry, or any fingle Person, not having a visible Estate sufficimen to tipple ent to support him, without Labour, to tipple or game, in such Ordinary, on Pain of on Pain of not being paid for any Liquor, or other Accommodation, which fuch Ordinary-Keeper shall supply such Person with, or which shall be lost by any fuch Person at any Game.

Ordinary-Keepers not to game in their own Houses, under 10 L nor fuf-Debt.

XXVII. Provided always, That no Ordinary-Keeper shall be restrained from supplying any of the Persons herein before mentioned, with Victuals or Liquors, in moderate and necessary Quantities, so as no Ordinary-Keeper shall trust any such Person, for more than Four Shillings, or the Value thereof, in any One Year.

Travellers may be supplied with all Necessaries.

XXVIII. And provided also, That no Ordinary-Keeper shall be hindered or restrained from selling to, or supplying Persons travelling upon their necessary Occasions, (so far distant from their own Habitations, as may render it impracticable or inconvenient to repair thither, and such l'ersons as may happen to be confined in such Ordinary, by Sickness, Severity of Weather, or other Accident, with Diet, and other necessary Accommodations) altho' the same shall amount unto more than the Sum of Four Shillings aforesaid.

And he it Enacted, That in any Action in a Court of Justice, or Juries to en-quire into Ac- Dispute before a single Magistrate, between any Ordinary-Keeper, and any tions brought Person in this Act described, such Court, and the Jury, in any Trial by a Jury, or fingle Magistrate, shall, by virtue of this Act, consider and enquire, whether any Debt, so sued for, or claimed, was contracted contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act; and, if it shall appear to such Court, and Jury, or Magistrate, that such Debt was contracted contrary to this Act, Plaintiff to be that then the Plaintiff shall be non-suit, and the Defendant recover his Cost of Suit: And that in case any Action or Demand shall be brought on any Obligation, under the Hand and Seal of any such Person, or upon any Note or Writing, under the Hand only of the Defendant or Debtor, or if any such Obligation, Note, or Writing, shall be given in Evidence, to support fuch
