An ACT for the Relief of the Poor, within the several Counties therein mentioned.

THEREAS the Necessity, Number, and continual Increase of the Preamble. Poor, within this Province, is very great, and exceedingly burthensome, which might be greatly lessened, by a due Regulation and Employment of them;

II.
