CHAP. Money, for his or her good Behaviour and more orderly Demeanor during the Space of Six Months; and also upon Complaint, and due Proof made by any one Trustee for the Poor, or the Overseer of said Alms and Work-House, to any one Magistrate of the said County, that any Person in the said Work-House hath behaved and demeaned him or herself in a disorderly Manner, or hath resused or neglected to do and perform his or her daily Labour and Task, or hath refused or neglected to obey, keep, and observe, any of the Ordinances, Rules, and Bye-Laws, of the said Corporation, to order and direct such moderate and proper Correction, not exceeding Thirty-nine Lashes for any one Offence, to be given to fuch Offender, as the Nature of the Case shall require.

Trustees to received.

Justices to commit Rogues, Ge. to hard Labour.

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to Poor shall be and for any of the said Trustees to direct and appoint, under their Hand, in Writing, what Poor shall be received into such Alms and Work-House; and it shall and may be lawful for any one Justice of the Peace for the faid County, and for any Person authorized and appointed by such Justice, to apprehend, or cause to be apprehended, and committed to the said Work-House, any Rogues, Vagrants, Vagabonds, Beggars, and other idle, dissolute, and disorderly Persons, found loitering or residing in the said County, who follow no Labour, Trade, Occupation, or Business, and have no visible Means of Subsistence whereby to acquire an honest Livelihood, there to be kept at hard Labour, for any Term not exceeding Three Months; and the Overseer of such Alms and Work-House is hereby required to receive any Poor, appointed as aforesaid to be received, and any Rogue, Vagrant, Vagabond, Beggar, and other idle, dissolute, and disorderly Persons, so as aforesaid committed, and employ them, according to the Tenor of such Commitment.

Penalty on Persons.

XIX. And be it further enasted; That every Person who shall be received into the said Alms or Work-House, and there receive Relief,: Work-House shall, upon the Shoulder of the right Sleeve of the uppermost Garment. of every such Person, in an open and visible Manner, wear such Badge or. Mark as is herein after mentioned and expressed; That is to say: A large Roman P. together with the first Letter of the Name of St. Mary's' County, cut either in red or blue Cloth, as by the Overseer of the Poor. shall be directed and appointed; and if such poor Person shall neglect or refuse to wear such Badge or Mark as aforesaid, and in Manner as aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful, for any one of the Trustees aforesaid, to punish every such Offender for every such Offence either by ordering his or her Relief, or usual Allowance, to be abridged, sufpended, or withdrawn, or otherwise, by ordering such Offender to be whipped, not exceeding Twenty Lashes, and kept to hard Labour for any Number of Days not exceeding Twenty-one, as to the said Trustee shall feem meet: And if any Overseer of the Poor shall receive into the said the Overseer Alms and Work-House, or shall relieve any such Person not having and relievingsuch wearing such Badge or Mark as aforesaid, and be thereof convicted upon the Oath of one or more credible Witness or Witnesses, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Pounds Current Money.

Penalty. on Persons Work-Houle.

XX. And be it further enaded, That whosoever shall presume either to set up a Booth, Stail, or other Convenience, for the selling of strong " Liquors, on the Land purchased for the Use of the said Alms or Workto the Poor, House, or shall commit any Kind of Trespass thereon, or shall sell or dispose of any strong Liquor, or other Matter or Thing whatsoever, to the Alms or any Poor, or other Person entertained in said Alms and Work-House, shall, for every such Offence, forseit and pay the Sum of Ten Pounds XXI. And Current Money.
