HAP.

Plater, Esq: the Reverend Mr. George Goundril, John Reeder, Thomas C Bond, Richard Barnes, Philip Key, and Henry Greenfield Sothoron, for Saint Mary's County; the Honourable Richard Lee, Esq; the Reverend Mr. Isaac Campbell, William Smallwood, Francis Ware, Josias Hawkins, George Dent, and Doctor James Craig, for Charles County; and the Honourable Benediet Calvert, Esq; the Reverend Mr. Henry Addison, Jesias Beall, Robert Tyler, Joseph Sim, Thomas Contee, and Doctor Richard Brook, for Prince-George's County, shall be Trustees for the said School, and shall qualify in the same Manner, and be subject to the same Penalties, and be invested with the same Rights, Privileges, Powers, and Authorities, to every Intent and Purpose, as the Visitors of the other County Schools within this Province, and shall have Succession in like Manner, so that every Vacancy be filled up with a Relident of that County wherein the faid Vacancy may happen, that an equal Number of Trustees residing in each County may be kept up; and any Fifteen or more of the said Trustees, with or without the said President, shall be and are hereby empowered to meet at the said School, from Time to Time, and they, or the major Part of them, so met, may do any Act, Matter, or Thing, which the faid President and Trustees might do, any Law to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

IV. And be it enacted, That of all Duties, Taxes, and Impositions, Of all Duhereafter to be collected for the Use of the County Schools within this be collected Province, there shall be paid, by the Treasurers of the Western and for County Eastern Shores, to the Trustees aforesaid, or the major Part of them, or Schools, \$ their Order, Three equal Dividends, by them to be applied and expend-dends to be ed, to and for the Use and Benefit of the said School, in the like Manner paid to the as the Dividends due to the other County Schools are by Law directed to Truffeet. be applied.

V. and whereas, For defraying Part of the Expence and Charge of building the said School, sundry the Inhabitants of the said Counties of Saint Mary's, Charles, and Prince-George's, have subscribed divers Sums of Money! And whereas, There is a confiderable Sum of Money in the Hands of the Visitors of the said Schools, chosen under a former Act of Assembly, for the faid Counties of Saint Mary's, Charles, and Prince-George's, Be it enacted; That the Trustees constituted by this Act; or the major Trustees to Part of them; that, and they are hereby empowered to receive all Mo-secrive all nies by the said Persons subscribed, and all Monies in the Hands of the subscriptions, and Visitors, chosen under the said former Law; and such Subscribers and Monicinathe Visitors are hereby directed to pay the Monies in their Hands, and their Hands of Visitors choseveral Subscriptions, to the Trustees appointed by this Act stand, in case sen under a of Neglect or Refusal to pay, the said Trustees, for the major Part of somer Act. them, may, and they are hereby authorized to fue for, recover, and receive the same, in an Action of Trespass on the Case, in which it shall be sufficient to declare for so much Money had and received by the Defendant for the Use of the Plaintiffs.

VI. And be it enacted, That the faid Truffees, residing in each To make County, or the major Part of them, are hereby authorized, empowered, Sale of the Schools in and required, to make Sale, by Way of public Vendue, of their faid St. Mary's, Schools, respectively, of Saint Mary's, Charles, and Prince-George's Charles, & Counties, with the Land thereto belonging, to the best and highest Bid-George's der, and convey the fame, in Fee Simple, to the Purchaser or Purcha-Counties, fers, his or their Heirs and Assigns, for ever; and the Money arising by Ec. the Sale thereof, as well as from Subscriptions, shall be applied to the Use of the faid School, any Law to the contrary notwithstanding.
