XIV. And, Whereas the other public Roads in the said Counties of C. H A. P. Anne-Arundel and Frederick, are very much out of Order, and in the XXI. XXII. present Method of amending and repairing them the Burthen of the little the Roads Labour performed thereon falls very unequally on the People, for Re- and Taxables medy whereof, and also to provide for keeping the public Roads in the in the several said Counties in Repair, Be it enacted, That the Overseer of the public Anne Arandel Roads, together with the taxable Inhabitants of the respective Hundreds & Friderick in the same Counties, shall at proper Seasons in every Year, for Seven use their En-Years next ensuing, and until the End of the next Session of Assembly deavours for which shall happen after the End of the said Seven Years, use their En- the Repair of said Roads, & deavours for the Repair of the said Roads, and shall be chargeable to la-shall be bour and work thereon so many Days as shall be necessary, not exceed chargeable to ing Six Days in any one Year; and every such taxable Inhabitant shall work thereon have and being with him a Sanda Color of the color o have and bring with him a Spade, Shovel, Pick, Mattock, Grubbing ing 6 Days in Hoe, Hilling Hoe, Crow Bar, or Sledge Hammer, or instead-thereof, anyone Year, if particularly required, an Axe, and shall diligently perform the Work and Labour to which he shall be appointed by the Overseer aforesaid; for Eight Hours in every of the said Days, with the said Tools.

XV. Provided always, That any fuch taxable Inhabitant as aforesaid, Provide or any Person chargeable for any Male Taxable, may employ and send an able and sufficient labouring Man in his Stead, or the Stead of any Male Taxable for whom he is chargeable; and shall be obliged to send one able and sufficient labouring Man in the Stead of each Female Negro Taxable for whom he shall be chargeable.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That the Overseers aforesaid, shall Taxables to fairly and impartially warn and employ the Taxables within their re-be employed factive Hundreds in Turn, and on the most convenient Process of the Turn, and spective Hundreds in Turn, and on the most convenient Parts of the Persons public Roads; and where one and the same Person shall have or be chargeable chargeable with more than one Tax, he or the shall not be obliged to than one to send more than one half of the whole Number of his or her Taxables in fend only one the same Hundred, on the same Day; and in Consideration of the extrate same Day; ordinary personal Trouble of the Overseers, all the Torobles of the Day; ordinary personal Trouble of the Overseers, all the Taxables of each &c. Overseer within the District of which he shall be Overseer, shall be exempt from Labour or Attendance on the public Roads.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That if any of the faid Overseers overseers no. shall, after the First Day of July next, voluntarily suffer any public gleeting to Road in his District to be out of Repair by the Space of Ten Days to-Roads to ingether, or shall neglect to clear and well grub any such Road, he shall curtherendincur the Penalty inflicted by Law on Overseers for neglecting to clear by Law the Roads, and the same Penalty may be recovered before any one Justice of the Peace of the County in which he resides, one Half thereof to the Use of the County towards defraying the Charge thereof, and the other Half to the Use of such Person who will inform or warrant for the same.
