Casks, with their true Marks and Numbers, and Owners Names, shall C H A P. be entered in a Book or Books to be kept for that Purpose, by the said Gauger, or his proper Deputy, to which Recourse may be had as Oecasion may require; for a Copy of which Entry they shall receive Threepence Common Money, and for each Cask so by them gauged and marked they shall receive the Sum of Four-pence Common Money, and no more: And if any Calk or other Vellel, gauged and marked by the faid Gauger, or his lawful Deputy, shall be found lacking one or more Gallons of the Quantity numbered or marked on the laid Calk or Vessel, the aforesaid Gauger shall forfeit Eight Shillings Cufrent Money for each Gallon lacking or exceeding the Number or Mark lo fet down on each Calk.

V. And be it turther enatted, That all and every the Penalties and Penalties, Forfeitures in and by this Act fet and appointed, shall be applied, one how to be re-Half towards defraying the County Charge, and the other Half to the applied Informer, or him or them that will sue or warrant for the same, if the said Penalties do not exceed Fifty Shillings Current Money, to be recovered before one Justice of the Peace as in Case of small Debts; and if above Fifty Shilling, to be fired for and recovered in any Court of Record within this Province:

VI. This Act to continue Three Years, and to the End of the next Continuance, Session of Assembly which shall happen thereafter.

## C H A P. XXIV.

An ACT for Payment of the public Creditors.

E it enacted, by the Right Honourable, the Lord Proprietary, by and Comissioners' with the Advice and Consent of his Governor, and the Upper and for emitting Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That of dit to deliver the Bills of Credit emitted or to be emitted by Virtue of the Act, en- to the Pertitled, An Act for emitting Bills of Gredit 1 and applying Part thereof, the fons allowed by the Pub-Commissioners for emitting Bills of Credit shall, and they are hereby au-lic, the Sums thorized and required, to deliver, out of the Eighty Thousand Pollars to ascertained by the Jourbe emitted by Virtue of the said Act, for the Purposes therein particu- nal of Aclarly mentioned, and for such other Purposes as should be appointed by counts. Act of the General Assembly, to the several Persons, their Executors, Administrators, Assigns, or Orders, who are allowed by the Public, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the Value, according to the Rate of One Dollar and Two Third Parts of a Dollar for every Hundred Pounds of Tobacco, and according to the Rate of Seven Shillings and Six-pence in Money, allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be allowed, stated, and ascertained by the Journal of Accounts, affented to this present Session by both Houses of Assembly.

II. And, For the Trouble of the said Commissioners, and their Clerk, Allowance to in the Payment of public Creditors, Benit enadled, that the said Com-the Commissioners and missioners shall be offlowed out of the faid Righty Thousand Dollars for their Clerk their Service and Trouble, to Mr. John Clapham Two Hundred Dollars, for their and to Mr. William Eddis One Hundred Dollars, and the Clerk of the said Commissioners shall be allowed Two Hundred Dollars, out of the said Eighty Thousand Dollars, for his Service and Trouble; and for the Service and Frouble of Mr. Robert Couden, one of the late Commissioners, there shall be allowed and paid to him out of the same Eighty Thousand Doldars the Number of One HundredDollars.
