the Family for the Year, and wearing Apparel, only excepted) accord-CHAP. ing to the true Value thereof; and that the same Pound Rate shall be XXI. assessed, paid, collected, and levied, for each of the Years seventeen hundred and seventy-seven and seventeen hundred and seventy-eight, in Manner herein after directed, and the true Value of all real and personal Property shall be ascertained, by the Assessor, to be appointed in Virtue of this Act, in Manner following, to wit: For every hundred Pounds worth of Property real or personal within this State, as the same would in the Judgment of the Assessor sell for in ready Money, there shall be set and assessed the Sum of ten Shillings for each Year, and after that Rate for every greater or lesser Sum. Provided, That if any Person shall be compelled by the Enemy to leave his Habitation, and be thereby rendered incapable to carry on his Business or Occupation, the Governor and the Council may direct the Collectors not to collect the Assessment from such Person until the General Assembly shall take Order therein.

Five Comin each County.

WIII. And be it enaced, That five sensible, discreet, and experienced mimoners to Persons shall be appointed in each County of this State, who shall be called Commissioners of the Tax, and they, or any three or more of them, shall be the Commissioners for such County.
