E it enasted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That if any Any person person within this state, between sixteen and fifty years of age, recruit for shall, on or before the fifteenth day of August next, furnish and three years deliver to any recruiting sergeant appointed by the governor and the to be exempt council, or any officer in any of the battalions raised by this state, an ry duty, &c. healthy able bodied recruit, being a freeman, or an Irish or American findented servant or apprentice, not employed in the trade of a ship car penter, gunsmith, blacksmith, tailor, shoemaker, or weaver, or in any linen, woollen, iron, or wire manufactory, to serve in any one of the battalions raised by this state for the term of three years; such person shall be exempt from any militia or military duty for the faid terms of three years, and such person is hereby required not to give more than hirty dollars reward to fuch recruit.
