any of the inhabitants of this state, as aforesaid, lie or they so refusing shall, for every offence, forfeit the sum of five pounds current money, one half thereof to the informer and the other half to the use of this state, and shall also forfeit to the uses aforesaid the goods so as aforesaid refused to be sold.

XIV. and be it enatted, That no goods, wares, or merchandise, Goods, &c. shall be exposed to sale by public vendue (except houshold furniture, at vendue. goods condemned in the court of admiralty, or fold under contract for that purpose heretosore made, or by distress for rent, or by process out of the courts of law or equity, or by the executor or administrator for any deceased person) under penalty of one hundred pounds on the perfon felling or buying at such vendue.

Be it enatted, That all and every of the persons, who Articles enun shave so engrossed the said articles as aforesaid, shall sell the fame sold at not by retail to the inhabitants of this state, at not more than the rate of more than ten per centum profit on the purchase money, reserving so much of the ods, faid articles as may be necessary for himself and family for one year, the and not felling more of the overplus of the article of falt to any perion the than shall be sufficient for the use of his family for one year, allowing e of some peck to each individual of such family.
