CHAP. XI, XII.

Two thoufand pounds to be applied in erecting falt works, &c.

XIX. And he it enacted, That the governor and the council be empowered to draw on the treasurer of the western shore, for a sum not exceeding two thousand pounds, and to apply the same, or so much as they may think necessary, in erecting salt works in such part or parts of this state as they may think most proper, and to employ a manager, and to direct any quantity made to be fold and distributed in the several counties, in proportion to the number of inhabitants in each county, allowing a peck to each person for the year.

Bounties allowed to private adventurers for making falt.

XX. And be it enacted, That the following bounties be allowed to private adventurers, (to whom no money has been or shall be advanced by the public) who shall before the first day of February next make falt within this state, to wit: For fifty bushels the sum of five pounds, for one hundred bushels ten pounds, for two hundred bushels twenty pounds, and for five hundred bushels fifty pounds, and the treasurer that of either shore shall pay the said bounties to any person bringing a certificate expressing the quantity, and the place and time whon and where made, from the court of the county wherein the salt shall be made.

Premium for making 1000 bushels.

XXI. And be it enafted, That a premium of two hundred pounds put a shall be paid by either of the treasurers to the first person, to whom again no money has been or shall be advanced by the public, who shall exceed produce a certificate from any county court of this state, of his shilling having made one thousand bushels of salt within this state, before the first day of February next.

XXII. ## C H A P. XII.

An ACT for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court.

Preamble.

HEREAS the recovery of small debts in the county courts is attended with heavy expence to the fuitors, and the jurisdiction of one justice of the peace by the law heretofore the do made, not being sufficiently extended for the conveniency and benefit to be of the people,

Where any debt doth not exceed 3 l. sterling, &c. any one justice may give judgment, &c.
