missioned by the governor and council, on the recommendation of the OHAP. general assembly, or in the recess of assembly by the governor and goungil; and the rank of each lieutenant, and of each battalion and company, shall be determined by the governor and council. And the faid lieutenants are hereby required to attend the governor and council as foon as conveniently they can, with a full and fair-lift of the names of all persons so enrolled as aforesaid, and of their distribution into battalions and companies. And the said lieutenants are hereby severally authorised and empowered to employ a clerk to assist in doing the business hereby enjoined him or them, and shall allow him a reasonable roward for his services, to be paid and re-imbursed as above set forthers

V. And be it enafted, That the several lieutenants shall, on or be-Lieutenants fore the first day of Saptember next, cause the several companies of min several comlitia, in their respective counties, to be divided by lot into eight parts, panies to be to be called classes, as nearly equal as may be, and numbered from one divided into to eight in numerical order. And the captain of each company shall &c. cause the names and sirnames of the persons in the respective companics, with the class to which each belongs, to be returned to faid lieutenants respectively, at such time as they shall appoint, under the penalty of five pounds common money for every neglect or refutal.

VI. And he it enaded, That the whole of the militia, so enrolled the militia as aforefaid, fhall he subject to be exercised in companies, under their are to beexrespective officers, as followeth; that is to say, some time in the ercised, &c. months of March, April, May, June, September, October, November, and December, and in battalion on the third Mondays (if fair, if not on the next fair day) in the months of April, June, September, and Navember; and on each of which days every militia man, fo enrolled, shall duly attend, with his arms and accourrements in good order, and a fergeant for clerk of each company is required, at the end of one hour after the time appointed for the meeting of the company or bate talion, ito call over the muster roll of the company, noting those who are absent, and on that day shall make return in writing to the captain or commanding officer then prefent of such absentees; and all the personsusa absent at the time of calling over the roll, or who shall depart from the parade before duby dissharged, shall be liable to the fines hereafter mentioned.
