XI. Be it enacted, That every person enrolled in any company of CHAP. any battalion ordered out as aforesaid, who neglected or refused to yield his personal service, and for whom a substitute was not found, shall be Persons who refused to charged and liable to pay such sum of money as the whole money paid serve to pay, for the substitutes provided for the draft of the battalion to which such person belonged will average for each substitute, and such average money thall and may be recovered by diffress and sale in the same manner as substitute money by the act to regulate the militia.

XII. And be it enaced, That all militia commissions which have Militia combeen issued in virtue of the powers delegated by the governor for the firmed. purpole of nominating and appointing officers, are and shall be ratified, confirmed, and deemed good and valid.

XIII. And he it enafted, That if any person or persons shall be sued Persons sued, or impleaded in any court or courts for acting in obedience to the orders this act in eor directions of the governor and the council, in any of the cases herein vidence. mentioned, such person or persons may, upon the general issue being pleaded, give this act and the special matter in evidence.

A P. XVIII. H

An ACT to ascertain the allowance of justices, jurymen, witnesses, and constables.

THEREAS it is thought reasonable and expedient to encrease Preamble. the allowance of justices, jurymen, withesses and constables, during the present high price of the necessaries of life:

II. Be it therefore enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, Justices, That from and after the publication of this act, each justice attending the county or orphans court shall be allowed fifteen shillings per day. for every day they shall attend in the said courts respectively.

III. And be it enaced, That each juryman and witness attending and witnesses; the general court, shall be allowed fifteen shillings for every day they shall attend, besides itinerant charges. That each juryman and witness. attending the county or orphans court, shall be allowed ten shillings per day, besides itinerant charges, where the witnesses come from other counties,

IV. and be it enaced, That the constables shall be allowed three To constables. shillings and nine pence for every warrant, and one shilling and three pence for every summons by them served.

V. This act to continue and be in force for twelve months, and until Continuance. the end of the next session of assembly that shall happen thereafter.
