And be it enacted, That the justices of the orphans courts in the Justices of ors feveral counties of this state shall, and they are hereby authorised and phans court to empowered, at the meeting of the faid orphans court, once in every ly on the treat furer, &c. quarter of the year, on application made to them by any person, agreeable to the direction and meaning of this act, to draw on the treasurer of the western or eastern shore of this state, for such sum or sums of money as may be necessary for answering the purposes aforesaid, and so to renew such orders quarterly; during the lives of the said persons entitled to receive their half pay as aforefaid, and during fuch time as the said justices shall deem such persons not totally disabled as aforesaid, entitled to receive the allowance by them directed to be made as above mentioned, which the treasurer is hereby required to pay and discharge. And, for the better charging the fald United States therewith, so that the fame may be brought into a general account; the justices of the hid courts are hereby enjoined to cause due entries to be made in their proceedings, of the name or names of all perfolts to whom drafts or orders shall be given in pursuance of this act; also of their places of relidence; in what regiment of company they ferved, the engagement on action in which they received their wound, and the sums allotted them; also of the death of such disabled person, or ceasing of such allowence; an account of all which they shall transmit, or cause to be transmitted, to the governor and council, on or before the first day of May in every year, on pain of forferting, for every failure herein, the sim of twenty pounds curtent money; a copy of which account the faid governor and council are hereby required to transmit quarterly to the secretary of congress or board of war, in order that a separate record may be there kept of the fame.

VI. And he it surther enacted, That no commissioned officer, non- no officer, &cr commissioned officer, or private soldier, of the army, commander, pay, unless he commissioned officer, wastrant officer, indrine, or seaman, of any of produces a of the thips of war of arfiled vessels of the United States, shall be entitled to his half pay, or other allowance, unless he produce to the justices of the faid orphans court, a certificate from the commanding, officer, who was in the same engagement in which he was so wounded, or in case of his death, from some other officer of the same corps, and the furgeon that attended him, or a certificate from the commander of the miprofewar, or armed veffel engaged in the action, in which any officer, marine, or feathan, received his wound, or, in case of his death, from fome other officer of the fame thip or vellel, and the furgeon-who aftended him; of the name of the person so wounded, his office, rank; department; regiment, company, thip of war or armed veffet, to which he belonged, his office or rank therein, the nature of his wound, and in what action or engagement he received it; which vertificates the said justices are hereby directed to cause to be registered, as well as all other proceedings by them to be done in virtue of this act, in a book by them to be kept for that purpose, under the penalty for every neglect thereof of twenty pounds current money.
