Fees allowed to justices, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of the several counties shall be allowed sees according to the following table, and shall not ask, demand, take, or receive, any greater or other fees, under the penalty of one hundred pounds for every offence, to be recovered by judgment in the county court, and applied to the use of the county to defray part of the charge thereof, VIZ.

III. And, Whereas it is thought reasonable and expedient to encrease the allowance of justices, jurymen, witnesses, and constables, during the present high price of the necessaries of life:

Allowance to juffices attending courts, &c.

IV. Be it enasted, That from and after the publication of this act, each justice attending the county or orphans court shall be allowed twenty-two shillings and six-pence per day for every day they shall attend in the courts respectively.

To jurymen and witnesses,

V. And be it enasted, That each juryman and witness attending the general court, shall be allowed thirty-five shillings for every day they shall attend, besides itinerant charges. That each juryman and witness attending the county or orphans court, shall be allowed twentytwo shillings and six-pence per day, besides itinerant charges where the witnesses come from other counties.

VI. And he it enacted, That the constables shall be allowed five To confable: shillings for every warrant, and two shillings and fix-pence for every VII. This fummons, by them served.
