XVII. C H A P.

An ACT for enlarging the powers of the governor and council.

HEREAS in times of imminent danger, it is necessary Preamble. for the safety and protection of the state, that extraordinary powers be vested in the governor and council, and it is at all times necessary, that a proper respect and regard be paid to the supreme executive authority:

II. Be it enacted, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That during During an invasion, &c. any invasion of this or any of the neighbouring states of Virginia, governor and Pennsylvania, or Delaware, by an army, or of this state by ships of council may war, the governor and council shall have full power and authority to ous persons to arrest, or cause to be arrested, any person or persons, whose going at be arrested, large they shall have good grounds to believe, from their own knowledge, or on information upon oath or affirmation of any credible witneis, may be dangerous to the state, and shall confine such person or persons in any gaol or place, or restrain and enjoin such person or persons to be and remain within any particular district or limits of this state, or in their discretion suffer such person or persons to go at large, giving security for his or their good behaviour; and during such invasion, no person, so arrested and imprisoned, or so restrained, shall have or receive any benefit or advantage from the habeas corpus act, but shall and may, if they think themselves aggrieved, apply by petition to the next general assembly, to which the names of all persons so arrested, committed, or confined, with the cause of their respective arrests, shall be returned by the governor and council.

And he it enasted, That the governor and council shall have as To have as full power and sull and ample power and authority as any judge or justice, to take re- any judge or cognizance of, and arrest and confine, or cause to be arrested and con-justice, &c. fined, any person or persons, who may have been, or shall be, guilty of any of the crimes and misdemeanors enumerated in the act, entitled, An act to punish certain crimes and misdemeanors, and to prevent the growth of toryism, or in an act to punish certain crimes, or who may have been, or shall be, guilty of the several offences enumerated in the thirty-fifth section of the act, entitled, An act for the better security of the government.

And be it enacted, That all recognizances taken by the go-All recognizances vernor and council, in virtue of this law, shall be as good and effectual by them good as if the same were taken by any judge or justice; and the governor and effectual. and council, having good ground to believe that a breach has been made of the condition of any fuch recognizance, may cause process to issue against the principal, and the surety or sureties, or either of them, from the courts of law, according to their known and established jur risdictions.
