shall, and he is hereby enjoined and required to make out a fair copy of the rate so made by the justices aforesaid, to be by him delivered to the sheriff of the county, who shall, and he is hereby authorised and required to collect the same, in the same manner the public affessment herein before mentioned is directed to be collected, for which he shall receive sive per cent. commission, and shall pay the same assessment to the order of the several county courts respectively, on or before the last day of August next; and in case of failure in payment, the justices of the said courts may cause the sheriff's bond to be put in suit for recovery of the same.

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LIV. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of the tax shall commissionhave full power and authority to call the several affestors before them, ers may correct the affestat the time limited for appeals, or at such other time or times as they ment, &c. in their discretion shall think reasonable, for the purpose of correcting the assessment or rate. And the said commissioners shall have full power and authority to correct the several lists of assessment in their respective counties, so as to make the same as nearly equal as possible; or may direct the several assessors, when before them, to make such corrections.

LV. And he it enaced, That where commissioners of the tax may May order have heard the party interested on appeal, who may have been over charged to be charged, and the money paid on the erroneous assessment, it shall and deducted, &c. may be lawful for the present commissioners of the tax to make the proper deduction out of the present tax, and direct the collector to make his collection accordingly.

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LVI. And, Whereas it is thought expedient that persons who have no families, and who make great sums by their trade or industry, and who pay no tax whatever under the rate or assessment, should contribute something towards the expences of government and the support of the war:

LVII. Be it enacted, That all able bodied male inhabitants of the Males having no families to feveral districts, who have no families, and are above the age of twen- be affested ty-one years and under fifty, and are not otherwise rated or assessed, 111. 51. &c. shall be assessed the sum of eleven pounds sive shillings, in lieu of all other taxes, and that the same assessment be collected by the collectors in the several counties in manner above mentioned, and be paid to the several treasurers at the time herein before specified, any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

LVIII. And, Whereas it is thought reasonable that all vessels, the property of persons residing in this state, and employed in carrying on toreign trade and commerce, should be assessed,

LIX. Be it enaued, That for every such vessel, at the time of her vessels to be entry with the naval officer, there shall be paid to the said naval of- per ton, &c. ficer where such vessel is entered, the sum of fifteen shillings for every ton burthen such vessel may be computed to carry, in lieu of all other affessment or rate; and the several naval officers shall be accountable, on oath, to the treasurer of the shore where such entry is made for the money so received, and shall pay the same, first deducting a commission
