C H A P. XXXVIII.

An ACT for calling out of circulation certain bills of credit emitted by act of affembly.

Preamble.

HEREAS, from the scarcity of specie and the want of a proper medium of trade, and for payment of the public debt, bills of credit, to the amount of one hundred and seventy-three thousand seven hundred and seventy-three dollars, were emitted and made current, by virtue of the act, entitled, An act for the payment of the public claims, for emitting bills of credit, and for other purposes therein mentioned, and it is now thought proper that the said bills of credit be called in, and the holders thereof paid for the same:
