by this act, shall be chargeable with two pounds of tobacco per month for every month any hoghead of tobacco shall lay over and above one year, and the inspector is hereby directed to receive the same.

LXXXIV. *Be it enacted*, That an act, entitled, An act for the regulation of the staple of tobacco, and for preventing frauds in his majesty's customs, be and is hereby repealed.

LXXXV. *And be it enacted*, That the allowance to inspectors for their trouble, and also to the proprietors of the warehouses in each county, and all penalties and allowances made in tobacco by this act, shall be payable in the new bills of credit, to be issued in virtue of the act for sinking the quota required by congress of this state of the bills of credit emitted by congress, at the rate of twelve shillings and sixpence per hundred, or in the present circulating paper currency, at the rate of twenty-five pounds per hundred.

LXXXVI. *And*, To supply the want of inspectors in such counties where none have been named, or if named are either dead or have not qualified,

LXXXVII. *Be it enacted*, That any three of the justices of the said counties may, at any time before the twentieth day of July next, nominate an inspector or inspectors, agreeable to the direction of the act for the special appointment of inspectors, and to encrease their salaries and the warehouse rent, to serve in their county until the fifteenth day of September next, and the person so appointed, before he acts as such, shall take the oaths or affirmations to the government required by the constitution, and act of assembly to punish certain crimes and misdemeanors, and to prevent the growth of toryism, and subscribe his declaration of his belief in the christian religion, and also the oath or affirmation of office prescribed by the act for the regulation of the staple of tobacco, and for preventing frauds in his majesty's customs, and may give his notes for all tobacco by him inspected; and the notes given by any inspector, in virtue of the said recited act, for the special appointment of inspectors, and in virtue of this act, shall be received in payment of the taxes now or hereafter to be imposed, and the inspector shall be entitled to the same allowances as are given by this act.

LXXXVIII. *And be it enacted*, That there shall be public warehouses for the inspection of tobacco, pursuant to this act, at the several places herein after mentioned, to wit: In Saint Mary's county, at Chaptico, on the land of Philip Key; at Saint Inegoës, on the land of Austin Milburn; at Wiccomico, on the land of John Lewellin; at Leonard-town, on the land of colonel Richard Barnes; on Saint Cuthbert's-creek, on the land of colonel Ignatius Fenwick; on Saint Mary's river, on the land of Vernon Hebb; at Town-creek, on the land of James Hopewell; the warehouses aforesaid to be under one inspector for each warehouse. In Kent county, at Langford's-bay, on the land of the late Richard Gresham, under one inspector. In Anne-Arundel county, at Elk-ridge landing, under two inspectors; at Indian landing, one inspector; at Taylor's landing, one inspector; at Pig-point, under two inspectors. In Calvert county, at the head of Saint Leonard's-creek, on the land of Alexander Somerville, one inspector; on Hunt-  
ing-creek,
