An ACT to settle and adjust the accounts of the troops of this state in the service of the United States, and for other purposes therein mentioned. Explained 1781 May c. 20, Supplement do dt c 35 x.

HEREAS, from a variety of causes, the United States Preamble. have not complied with their engagements heretofore made with their officers and foldiers (which has occasioned great and unavoidable difficulties and distresses in the service) to whose virtuous and difinterested exertions America is much indebted:

II. Be it therefore enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, A commissional, That Zephaniah Turner be and is hereby appointed commissioner to &c. settle and adjust the pay due to the officers and soldiers of the troops of this state, and the fald commissioner is hereby empowered and directed to estimate, in specie, all sums of paper money received by the said officers and foldiers, on account of their pay or otherways, agreeable to a seale of depreciation herein after mentioned, according to the value thereof at the time of the money received; and that all cloathing furnished by this state to their officers and soldiers, which were not properly chargeable to the United States, shall be deducted out of their pay, at the value aforefaid in specie.

III. And be it enacted. That the faid commissioner is hereby em- to give certipowered and directed to give to the officers and soldiers aforesaid, to ficates, &c. whom pay as aforefaid may be found due, after deducting for cloathing furnished as aforesaid, one certificate or more, bearing interest from the date thereof, and specifying the sum due in specie, so that no certificate shall be for less than one fifth part of the sum due to the person so whom the same shall be given, and that the whole of the certificates given to the same person shall amount to the sum only due to him, which certificate shall be paid out of such part of confiscated British property as shall be appropriated for that purpose; and the commishoner is hereby directed to provide printed certificates, in fuch manner and form as he shall judge necessary, to be by him applied to the uses and purpofes aforefaid.

IV. And be it enaued. That in order to prevent the certificates of Certificates not transferrathe non-commissioned officers and privates aforesaid from being coun-ble, &c. terfeited, or becoming objects of speculation, no transfer or assignment of the same shall be good and valid in law or equity, unless attested by the officer commanding the regiment or troops to which such soldier shall belong.

V. And be it enaued, That the said commissioner shall in like man-Commissioner ner fettle and adjust the pay and accounts of all officers and soldiers pay of officers, who have fallen or died in the service, and their widows and children &c. shall be entitled to such certificates, and to all the benefits and advantages thereby granted to the officers and foldiers in the faid service.

VI. And be it enacted, That the said commissioner, previous to his Oath of comis entering on the duties required of him by this act, shall take the following oath or affirmation, to wit: "I, A. B. do swear or affirm (as
