And be it further enacted, That the vestrymen and other inhabitants of the parishes aforesaid, qualified for the purpose, are hereby authorised and empowered to meet at their several parish churches, or vestry houses, on the last Monday in July next, in order to choose two vestrymen and two churchwardens, in the same manner and form they were to have done on the aforesaid Easter Monday last.

C H A P. VIII.

An A C T to repeal the act of assembly to regulate auctions.

BE it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act of assembly, entitled, An act to regulate auctions, passed at a session of assembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on the seventeenth day of October last past, shall be and is hereby repealed.

An act repealed.

C H A P. IX.

An A C T to enable Thomas Barnett and Jane his wife to exchange part of a tract of land called Ennalls's Outrange, with Robert Harrison, for part of a tract of land called Manning's Marsh.

WH E R E A S it doth appear to this general assembly, that Thomas Barnett, of Dorchester county, and Jane Trevilion Barnett, his wife, are seized of a certain tract of land called Ashburn, in the county aforesaid, which was devised to her the said Jane in fee, by her late father, Thomas Manning, deceased; and that the said Thomas Barnett and Jane his wife are also seized of part of another tract of land called Ennalls's Outrange, containing fifty-three acres of land, which was also devised to her the said Jane in fee, by her said father, which last mentioned tract of land lies at some distance from Ashburn, and that the said Thomas and Jane are very desirous of exchanging the said tract of land called Ennalls's Outrange, with a certain Robert Harrison, for fifty-three acres of land of equal value, being part of a tract of land called Manning's Marsh, which would render the aforesaid tract of land called Ashburn of considerable more value; and that the said Robert Harrison is willing to exchange the said fifty-three acres of Manning's Marsh for the like quantity of Ennalls's Outrange, provided the said Jane, now under the age of twenty-one years, should be enabled by an act of assembly to make the said exchange, to which said exchange the same Robert Harrison hath declared his entire consent:

Preamble.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said Thomas Barnett and Jane his wife shall be and are hereby enabled by deeds, to exchange with the aforesaid Robert Harrison the aforesaid part of a tract of land called Part of Ennalls's Outrange, containing fifty-three acres of land in the county of Dorchester aforesaid, for fifty-three acres of land, part of Manning's Marsh, more convenient to the aforesaid tract of land called Ashburn.

III. And be it enacted, That on the due and legal execution and acknowledgment of the aforesaid deeds between the aforesaid Thomas Barnett
