C H A P. XI.

An ACT to regulate auctions in Baltimore-town in Baltimore county.

E it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That after the No person to, passing this law, no person shall act as an auctioneer, within tioneer with-Baltimore town in Baltimore county, or within three miles of ou licence, the faid town, unless licented and appointed agreeable to this act; and if any person, without such licence, shall sell any property at auction, within the said town of Baltimore, or within three miles thereof, and be thereof convicted in the general court, or Baltimore county court, such person shall forseit and pay ten pounds current money for every hundred pounds of property by him so sold, and in the same proportion for any greater or less sum; and any person employing any person not licensed as aforesaid to sell any property at auction, within the faid town or three miles thereof, shall forfeit and pay ten pounds like money for every hundred pounds of property fo fold by his direction or with his consent, and in the same proportion for any greater or less sum, to be recovered as aforesaid.

II. And be it enaded, That Thomas Yates is hereby licensed and T. Yates and pointed for appointed auctioneer for the said town, who shall, before he acts as Baltimores fuch (under the penalty of two hundred pounds current money) take town, &c. the oaths to the government required by the constitution and act of afsembly (unless he hath heretofore taken them) and give bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds current money, with fuch fureties as the commissioners of the said town shall approve, with condition, "That he will faithfully execute the office and trust reposed in him, as auctioneer for Balti nore-town, agreeable to law, and in all things well and faithfully execute and perform the several duties required or him by this act;" and take the following oath (which any justice of the peace or any one of the faid commissioners may administer) to wit: do fwear, that I will faithfully and honeftly execute "I, the office and trust reposed in me as audioneer for Baltimore-town, and will well and faithfully perform the several duties required of me by law, without any partiality, fraud, or deceit."

III. And be it enacted, That the said auctioneer shall be answerable Answerablato to the commissioners of the said town, and his bond and securities liable finners, &c. for the payment of one pound on every hundred pounds worth of property by him fold at auction, and in the same proportion for any greater or less sum, and shall once in every three months (or oftener if required) account upon oath, and pay the fame to the committioners of the faid town, to be applied by them to the amending and repairing the streets thereof.

IV. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of the town afore- Who may refaid may remove the auctioneer aforesaid for misbehaviour in his office, &c, and may appoint another in his stead; and in case the said auctioneer shall refign his appointment, or remove out of the faid town, or die, the commissioners aforesaid may appoint another in the place of the auctioneer to refigning, removing, or dying.
