and directed immediately to cause the ears to be cut off, and the tongue CHAP taken out, of and from the head or heads of fuch wolf or wolves, to prevent such head or heads from being a second time carried before a justice, in order to obtain a certificate.

III. And be it enasted, That every person or persons who shall pro- To be allowduce a certificate as aforesaid, to the justice of the county wherein the faid wolf or wolves were killed, at the levy county court, shall for every old wolf's head be allowed forty shillings, and for every young wolf's head be allowed fifteen shillings, to be by the said justices assessed and levied in the county levy, together with the sheriff's salary for collecting the same, and to be paid by the sheriff to such person of persons as shall be entitled to the same as aforesaid.

IV. This act to continue for one year, and to the end of the next Continuance. session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

H A P. XIX.

An ACT to enable the vifitors of Anne-Arundel county school to qualify themselves to execute their trust.

THEREAS it is represented to this general affembly, that Preamble, the late visitors of Anne-Arundel county school, from inattention, did not take, repeat, and subscribe, the oath of fidelity to this state, prescribed by the act to punish certain crimes and misdemeanors, and to prevent the growth of toryism, agreeable to the directions thereof, by means whereof the said visitors were disqualified to discharge the trust reposed in them: And whereas it is necessary, for the good government of the said school, that the said visitors should be enabled to discharge the said trust;

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Visitors to faid visitors, on their subscribing a declaration of their belief in the ers after quachristian religion, and taking the several oaths required of visitors of lifying, &c. schools by the constitution and laws of this state, shall from thenceforth be, and are hereby, vested with as full and ample powers as any visitors of schools have heretofore had and enjoyed.

An ACT to explain and amend the act to settle and adjust the accounts of the troops of this state in the service of the United States, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

THEREAS, on the sale by the commissioners appointed to Preamble, preserve confiscated British property, of some lots and parcels of land in or near Baltimore-town, some of the purchasers have tendered the first payment in certificates issued by the commissioner appointed to settle the accounts of the state troops, and it was the evident intention of the affembly, that the first payment should be in specie only, and the property would have sold for a much greater
