and soldiers of the Maryland line; and it being the wish and intention CHAP. of this affembly to make an equitable compensation to all officers and foldiers belonging to this state, who have served and adhered to the cause of America: And whereas, by omission, sundry officers and soldiers, who have deserved well from this state, could not, agreeable to the faid laws, receive certificates for the depreciation of their pay:

II. Be it therefore enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, Commissioner That the commissioner appointed to settle and adjust the accounts of the invalid the officers and soldiers of this state, be authorised and directed to settle corps, &c. and adjust the accounts of the officers and soldiers of the invalid corps, who were raised from citizens of, or properly belonging to, this state, upon the certificates of the commanding officers, and to grant certificates for the amount thereof, in the same manner, and upon the same principles, as officers and soldiers of the Maryland line were settled with agreeable to the acts aforefaid.

III. And be it errated, That the commissioner shall in like manner with the refettle and adjust the pay and accounts of all officers and soldiers, who of persons were of this state and in the service of the United States, who have dead, &c. fallen in battle or died, and grant certificates for the amount thereof to their devices or legal repretentatives, or to such person or persons as they may have directed to receive the same.

- IV. And, Whereas troops have been raised in this state in the beginning of the war, who were afterwards turned over to the continental establishment, and the commissioner being doubtful whether they were entitled to the depreciation of their pay while in the particular service of this state:
- V. Be it therefore enasted, That the commissioner be authorised with state and directed to settle with, and grant certificates to, such officers and troops, &c. foldiers, for the depreciation of their pay, while in the particular fervice of this state, in the same manner, and upon the same principles, as if they had been on the continental establishment.
- VI. and be it enaded. That the commissioner, in like manner, be With col.
 Rawlings, &c. authorised and directed to settle with, and grant certificates to, lieutenant-colonel Moses Rawlings, for the amount of the depreciation of his pay, from the first day of January seventeen hundred and seventyseven, to the second day of June seventeen hundred and seventy-nine.
- VII. and be it enaued. That the governor and council he requested Certificate to to direct the treasurer of the western shore to grant his certificate to be granted to colonel Luke Marbury, for the depreciation of his accounts and pay, &c. amounting to the sum of twelve hundred and fifty-eight pounds four shillings and three-pence current money, agreeable to the act of last testion to adjust the debts due from this state.
- VIII. And be it enatted, That the commissioner aforesaid shall settle Commissioner the account of captain Samuel Turbutt Wright, late of the second capt. Wright, Maryland regiment, from the first of January seventeen hundred and &c. seventy-seven till the thirtieth of May seventeen hundred and seventyeight, and grant his certificates for the amount thereof.
