

C H A P. XXIX, XXX. seven shillings and six-pence per bushel, by order of the governor and council on the commissary of provisions for this state.

Allowance to delegates to congress.

III. And be it enacted, That each delegate to congress from this state shall be allowed the sum of thirty-five shillings current money for every day he shall attend, or be on his journey to or from congress; and the governor and council are requested to sell, from time to time, any specific articles which may be on hand, and transmit to the delegates in congress such sums of money as may be necessary, not exceeding the allowance aforesaid.

To the commissioners on British property.

IV. And be it enacted, That a commission of two and an half per cent. be allowed to the commissioners for the preservation and sale of confiscated British property, on the amount of the sales, in full for their services, and the allowance to their clerk, and all expences, except only the charge of surveying the land and advertising the same for sale, the said commission to be paid in bills of credit, or wheat, as before mentioned.

V. And, Whereas the governor, in the last year, expended a considerable sum of money beyond his salary :

Compensation to the governor for last year.

VI. Be it enacted, That the sum of five hundred pounds current money be allowed to the governor, as a compensation for such extraordinary expence, to be paid in bills of credit, or wheat, at the value or price, and in the manner, herein before directed.

C H A P. XXX.

An ACT for the payment of the journal of accounts.

Preamble.

**W** H E R E A S it appears, by the journal of accounts and list of debts, that there is now due from this state the sum of seven thousand three hundred and one pounds ten shillings and four-pence current money, and eighty-eight thousand and thirty pounds of tobacco :

Treasurer to pay the journal, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore shall, and he is hereby authorized and required to deliver, out of the bills of credit of the last emission, to the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns, or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be stated and ascertained by the journal of accounts and list of debts aforesaid.

Creditors may receive certificates, &c.

III. And be it enacted, That all or any of the public creditors on the journal, for money, may have their election to receive a certificate or certificates from the treasurer of the western shore, signed by him, and expressing the sum of current money due to such creditor or creditors, which shall be discounted by the collector in payment of the taxes due on the present assessment acts, or on any future assessments, or if not so discounted, the treasurer of the eastern or western shore shall receive the said certificates, and pay the same to the bearer, out of the money now in the treasury, or which may hereafter be brought into the
