Commissioners appointed, &c.

VI. **And be it enacted,** That the honourable William Paca, Matthew Tilghman, and Robert Goldsborough, Esquires, be appointed commissioners; and that they, or any two of them, may procure, fit out, arm and man, the said barges, and galley or vessel of force, and to provide all necessaries, and hospital and other stores, for the use of the officers and men; and to appoint proper persons to enlist the seamen, watermen, and marines, and to direct what bounty and pay shall be given to them respectively, agreeable to such instructions as they shall receive from the general assembly; and they shall lay an account of the receipts and expenditures of all money applied to this service before the next session of the general assembly.

Money appropriated, &c.

VII. **And be it enacted,** That a sum not exceeding ten thousand pounds current money be appropriated to the execution of this act, and that military stores and provisions for rations be furnished out of the public magazines and stores.

Certain money to be paid, &c.

VIII. **And,** to procure the said money, **Be it enacted,** That two thousand pounds, arising from the late sales of confiscated British property, and now or daily expected to be paid to the commissioners for the sales of such property, be paid by them to the commissioners appointed to fit out the said galley and barges.

Sales of certain lots to be confirmed, &c.

IX. **And be it enacted,** That the commissioners for the preservation and sale of confiscated British property, be authorized and directed to confirm the sales heretofore made of certain lots on Whetstone-point to the first purchasers, if they will make their first payment within fifteen days after notice; and, in case of their default, to the second purchasers, if they will make their first payment within five days after the expiration of the said fifteen days; and, upon default, the said commissioners may sell the same upon the terms expressed for selling certain confiscated British property by the act of last session of assembly to raise recruits; and the said commissioners are directed to give notice to the said purchasers as soon as possible, and to call on such purchasers of lots on Whetstone-point who have made their first to make their second payment.

Lots in Baltimore town, &c. to be sold.

X. **And be it enacted,** That the said commissioners be authorized and directed to sell at auction, after two weeks notice, certain lots of confiscated British property in Baltimore-town, or other unappropriated British property, on the terms in the act to raise recruits passed last session, to the amount of one thousand pounds current money; provided that no property be sold for less than the last assessment thereof.

Money received for land warrants to be applied, &c.

XI. **And be it enacted,** That all money received since the first day of May last, or which shall be received before the first day of January next, for land warrants, or for composition on certificates, and the money to become due on the third payments for British property sold in virtue of the act to raise recruits, shall be applied, so far as may be necessary, to the execution of this act.
