III. And be it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid, or the Present court-house to be sold, &c.
major part of them, be authorized and required to expose to sale, at auction, after the tenth day of July next, and after eight weeks notice of the sale, by advertisements set up at the most public place in the county, the present court-house and prison, and the land in Queen's-town belonging to the county, and on payment of the money, to execute and acknowledge a deed of bargain and sale for the same to the purchaser.

IV. And be it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid, or the How the money is to be applied.
major part of them, be authorized and required, immediately after the said sale, and out of the money arising therefrom, to pay for the land procured for the erecting the new court-house and prison, and to apply the residue of the money towards erecting the new prison.

V. And be it enacted, That the justices of Queen-Anne's county be Justices to agree for a place to hold courts, &c.
authorized and required to contract and agree for a convenient place near Chester-mill, to hold the courts for the county aforesaid, and also for their books, papers, and records, and also for a fit building for the custody of prisoners; and from and after the tenth day of July next, the several courts and elections for the county aforesaid shall be held, and the records kept, at such places as shall be provided by the justices aforesaid, for the purposes aforesaid, until the court-house and prison shall be built at the place laid out by the commissioners aforesaid for that purpose, or until buildings convenient for holding the said courts shall be erected there, which ever may first happen; and that the several courts and elections, as soon as conveniently may be, shall be held at the place laid out as aforesaid, and not elsewhere.

VI. And be it enacted, That the expence of procuring such places Expence to be defrayed by the county.
for holding the courts and records as aforesaid until the court-house and prison are erected, shall be defrayed by the county as other county charges.

C H A P. V.

An A C T to prevent the exportation of bread and flour not merchantable from George-town in Montgomery county, and for other purposes.

BE it enacted, *by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the act to Act to apply to George-town, &c.
prevent the exportation of bread and flour not merchantable, and for other purposes, made and passed at a session of assembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on Monday the fifth of November, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-one, have full force and operation, and apply in the same degree and manner, to George-town in Montgomery county, as if made for said town, after the first day of August ensuing.
