aforsaid act, by which means the exportation of Pennsylvania and Virginia made flour from this state is prevented: Therefore, Be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to export Pennsylvania and Virginia flour, packed in Pennsylvania and Virginia casks, of a size and make conformable to the regulations of the laws of the said states, from the ports of Baltimore and George-town aforsaid, provided that the flour is merchantable agreeable to the regulations of this state, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Continuance. III, T H I S act to continue and be in force for and during the term of the act to prevent the exportation of bread and flour not merchantable, and for other purposes.

## C H A P. VI.

An A C T to authorise the commissioners for the preservation and sale of confiscated British property, to convey certain lands to William Winder.

Preamble.

**W** H E R E A S it appears to this general assembly, that William Winder, of Somerset county, by his agreement, at the rate of twenty-five pounds current money per hundred acres, with the commissioners of the late lord Baltimore, and by virtue of a warrant issued from the revenue-office, on the fourth day of October, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-one, and executed on the twelfth day of November, in the same year, acquired an equitable title to the lands and tenements in Wiccomico manor, described and contained in a certificate of survey thereof, called Sandy-plains; and it appearing to this general assembly just and reasonable, that the same should be confirmed unto the said William Winder in fee simple:

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioners for preservation and sale of confiscated British property, or any one of them, have full power and authority, and they are hereby directed, on payment by the said William Winder, or any other person in his behalf, at the rate of twenty-five pounds currency per hundred acres, for the land called Sandy-plains, contained in the certificate aforsaid, to convey and confirm the same unto the said William Winder and his heirs for ever.

## C H A P. VII.

An A C T declaring, that the causeway leading through Pocomoke-swamp to Snow-hill, be repaired and maintained at the charge of Worcester county.

Preamble.

**W** H E R E A S it is represented to this general assembly, that the said causeway has been for some time repaired at the expence of a few individuals; and it appearing that the same causeway leads to the town of Snow-hill, and is used as a high-way by very many of the inhabitants of Worcester county, and that it ought to be maintained at the charge of the county:
