and the different branches of the mathematics, are taught in the fame, under a sufficient number of able and approved masters; that innery of the students are preparing and definous to enter upon a course of philo-Sophy, and multirepair to some other state, at a very gizvous and inconvenient expence, to finish their education, unlets they, the faid vifitors, are enabled to enlarge the plan of the faid ichool, by ingrafting shereon a system of liberal education in the arts and sciences and providing necessary books and apparatus, with an additional number of masters and protessors; and the faid visitors have surther expressed their affurance, that if they were made capable in law of creeting the ful school into a college or general teminary of learning for the castern shore, or penintula between the bays of Chefapeake and Delaware (maintaining the original design of the said leshool as a foundwion not to be violated) very confiderable tums could be raited in a tew years. within the faid penintula, by free and voluntary contributions, for the establishment and support of such seminary, and have accordingly prayed, that a law may be passed to enable them, the said viscors, to enlarge and improve the faid tchool into a college, or place of univertal learning, with the utual privileges: Now this general affembly, taking the faid petition into their serious consideration, and being desirous to encourage and promote knowledge within this state, have agreed to enach;

II. and be it enasted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the into a college, said Joseph Nicholson, James Anderson, John Scot, William Boardly, Peregrine Lethebury, William Smith, and Benjamin Chambers, the present visitors of Kent county school, and their successors, shall have full power and authority to erect the said school into a college or seminary of universal learning, and to encrease the number of visitors and governors thereof to swenty-four, in manner following, that is to fay: First, The said visitors of Kent county school, and their successors, for and during the term of five years next after the passing of this act, are hereby empowered and made capable to receive contributions and lubscriptions, for the said intended college or seminary of universal learning, of any person or persons who may be willing to promote so good a defign; and, in case any number or denomination of contributors in any county of the eastern shore of this state, or of the peninsula aforefaid in the neighbouring states, shall subscribe and engage to pay towards the founding and supporting the said intended college, any sum not lets than five hundred pounds current money, payable in Spanish milled dollars, or the value thereof, as the same may be, at the times of payment, in good merchantable wheat or tobacco, the faid visitors and their successors may covenant and agree with such subscribers and contributors, that there shall be one visitor and governor of the said college chosen for ever out of such county, for every five hundred pounds of specie so subscribed and paid, or secured to be paid, towards founding and supporting the faid college, and that the first election of every firch county visitor and governor of the said college shall be made by the subscribers and contributors in the county, within three months after the sum of five hundred pounds, or the value thereof, shall be subscribed and paid, or secured to be paid, as af resaid; and due notice of the time and place of election shall be given to the subcribers and contributors in every county, in such form and manner as shall be agreed upon by the visitors of Kent county school, and set forth in the preamble of the subscription papers, which the faid visitors shall send
