C H A P. XII.

A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to enable naval officers to grant registers for vessels.

E it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all ships may be registered, &c. or vessels, built by any inhabitant of this state for any citizens of the United States, or any vessel, the property of, or built for, a subject of any power or state not at enmity or war with this state, may be registered in the manner directed by this act.
