

said writings, under the seals of the said commissioners, or of any two of them who shall act, shall be acknowledged by them before some justice of the peace for Prince-George's county, or a judge of the general court, and recorded among the records of the county or general court, and, with this act, shall be received as evidence of the right of the said Anthony and Eleanor; provided that nothing in this act, or any thing done in pursuance thereof, shall be construed to affect the right of any person or persons not claiming from, by, or under, the said Henry Addison, since the fourth day of July, seventeen hundred and seventy-six.

C H A P. XXVII.

An ACT to make valid the proceedings of the commissioners of the tax for Dorchester county.

WHEREAS it appears that the commissioners of the tax for Dorchester county were prevented, by sickness or unavoidable accident, from performing the duties required of them by the act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two, on the days mentioned in said act, but that the duties were performed as soon thereafter as was in the power of the said commissioners:

Preamble.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all matters and proceedings performed by the commissioners of the tax for Dorchester county, in pursuance of the act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two, shall be as effectual and valid as if they had been performed on the days and at the times mentioned in said act.

III And, Whereas the commissioners of the tax for Dorchester county may be liable to certain fines and forfeitures, for not performing sundry duties required to be done by them on particular days mentioned in the act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two: Be it enacted, That the commissioners of the tax for Dorchester county are exonerated and discharged from all fines, forfeitures, and penalties, which they have incurred, in all matters relating to the act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two.
