XXXIX, XL.

IV. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of Baltimore-town pay to the said special commissioners all monies paid to them, or in their hands, by virtue of their powers for repairing the streets of said town.

Commissioners to pay all monies, &c.

V. And be it enacted, That all and every fine and forfeiture, heretofore appropriated, or that hereafter may be appropriated, for the repair of said streets, or for the use and benefit of said town, be collected by or paid to the said special commissioners, or to their treasurer, to be by them appointed, and applied according to the intention of this act.

Fines, &c. to be paid to special commissioners, &c.

VI. And, Whereas the aforesaid appropriations may be inadequate, Be it enacted, That the said special commissioners may borrow, to the amount of five thousand pounds current money, from the inhabitants of said town, pledging for the discharge thereof the whole or any part of the above appropriations, the money so borrowed to be applied as aforesaid.

Who may borrow money, &c.

VII. And be it enacted, That Baltimore-street be first paved, and that those streets which are most essential to the welfare and trade of the town, be paved in succession, till the whole be completed, or such parts of them as appear necessary to be paved by the aforesaid special commissioners.

Baltimore-street to be first paved, &c.

VIII. And be it enacted, That the special commissioners render annually an account of the receipts and expenditures of all monies to the commissioners of Baltimore-town, and publish in the Baltimore newspapers, in the first month of every year, a copy of the said account.

Account to be rendered, &c.

IX. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners, or any four or more of them, be authorized to execute the trust and duties reposed in them by this act; and in case of the death, resignation, or removal from the said town, by either of them, the residue, or a majority of them, may fill up such vacancy.

Four commissioners may act, &c.

X. THIS act to continue for five years, and until the end of the next session of assembly that shall happen thereafter.

C H A P. XL.

An ACT relating to the fines to be imposed on jurymen, witnesses, and constables.

BE it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That in all cases in which jurors or witnesses shall be summoned to appear at the general court, and shall, without sufficient excuse, neglect to appear, the general court may fine every such delinquent not exceeding
