MACT to empower Robert Dick to settle and collect the debts due to David Dalzell, George Oswald and company, and Oswald, Denniston, and company, or either of them, and to apply the same.

HEREAS Robert Dick, of Prince-George's county, hath Preamble; by his petition to this general affembly fet forth, that he has carried on the business as a merchant for many years revious to the present war, a factor for and partner with David Dal-Il, George Oswald and company, merchants of Glasgow, from the sumencement of the partnership until the year seventeen hundred and wenty-one, when David Dalzell died, and from that time as factor ad partner with Oswald. Denniston and company, ander both of which sons debts were contracted in this state; some of which are still due to e said partnership; and that the said company of Glasgow merchants we unto the faid Robert Dick a fum exceeding the whole amount of e debts due to them in this state, which he apprehends he has it not . I in his power to recover, unless he can receive it from this state; and therefore prays that a law may pass, authorising him, his heirs or
