CHAP. LI, LII, LIII.

C H A P. LI.

An ACT to encrease the allowance of jurymen attending the general court.

Allowance to jurymen encreased, &c. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the allowance of grand and petit jurymen, hereaster attending the general court on the eastern and western shore, shall be encreased, from eighty pounds of tobacco, payable at twelve shillings and sixpence per hundred, to one hundred and twenty pounds of tobacco, payable in the same manner; and their allowance for itinerant charges shall be encreased in the same proportion, the allowance to be made, as heretofore, on the journal of accounts.

To be made on the journal. II. And he it enacted, That the allowances to be made to the jurymen of the general court of the western and eastern shores, on the journal of accounts, hereafter shall be one hundred and twenty pounds of tobacco per day, payable as aforesaid.

For attendance in May term, &c. III. And he it enacted, That the grand jurors, who attended the general court of the western shore in May term, seventeen hundred and eighty-two, be allowed forty pounds of tobacco per day, in addition to the eighty allowed them heretofore, and the said additional allowance payable in the same manner.

IV. THIS act to continue and be in force until the end of the next session of assembly.

C H A P. LII.

An ACT to vest in Samuel Chase and Allen Quynn, Esquires, and their heirs, in trust, and for the uses therein mentioned, the theatre in the city of Annapolis.

Theatre granted in trust, &c. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the lot of ground in the city of Annapolis, on which the theatre is erected and stands, with the said theatre and its appurtenances, be and is hereby granted to Samuel Chase and Allen Quynn, Esquires, and their heirs, in trust, and for the use of John Henry, and others of the American company of comedians; and the same shall be used and enjoyed by the aforesaid John Henry, and others of the aforesaid company, according to their respective rights and interests, in the manner, and subject to the rents and covenants, expressed in a lease from William Reynolds, late of the city of Annapolis, deceased, and by virtue of which the said John Henry, and others of the American company of comedians, acquired the aforesaid premises.

C H A P. LIII.

An ACT to empower Catherine Woolsey to sell the real estate of George Woolsey, her late husband, for the purposes therein mentioned.
