

transmit to the collector of the county where such person shall reside, a copy of the valuation made on the property of such person in his county, and such collector, on receipt thereof, shall enter the same under the district where such person shall reside, and collect the same.

C H A P.
VI.

XXXII. And be it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid shall and may divide their respective counties into convenient districts, containing not less than one or more than three entire hundreds; and the said collector, with the approbation of the said commissioners, shall appoint a deputy in each district, for whom he shall be answerable.

XXXIII. And be it enacted, That the commissioners shall, on or before the first day of May next, make out and deliver to the collectors an alphabetical list of the persons in each district chargeable for the property therein, the amount of the valuation of each person's property respectively, as made by them, or as returned by the assessors, or as corrected by them, expressing the sum to be paid thereon by this act.

XXXIV. And be it enacted, That every person shall, on or before the twentieth day of May next, pay to the collector of the county, or his deputy of the district where his property was valued, one half part of the assessment imposed by this act; or he may discharge ten shillings part thereof in any of the articles following, that is to say, good fresh merchantable pork, delivered before the first day of March next, well fattened on corn, and each hog exceeding ninety pounds weight, at twenty-seven shillings and six-pence per hundred; good merchantable barrelled pork, containing at least two hundred and twenty pounds of net pork, at four pounds fifteen shillings per barrel; good clean merchantable wheat, weighing not less than fifty-eight pounds per bushel, at five shillings and three-pence per bushel; crop tobacco, inspected since the first day of April last, in hogheads weighing not less than nine hundred and fifty net, at nineteen shillings per hundred, with an allowance of four per cent. for the cask; good, sweet, fresh, merchantable, fine wheat flour, packed in such barrels as may by law be exported from Baltimore and George-town, at fifteen shillings for each short hundred weight, with allowance of three shillings for the barrels and nails.

XXXV. And be it enacted, That where any person, whose property is chargeable with the rate by this act imposed, shall be under the age of twenty-one years, if the parent or guardian of such infant shall make payment, the same shall be allowed him in his account with such infant.

XXXVI. And be it enacted, That if an executor or administrator shall have any personal estate of the deceased in his hands, chargeable with the assessment imposed by this act, he may inform the assessor, and on payment of the rate, the receipt of the collector shall be sufficient evidence to discharge such executor or administrator for the sum by him paid.

XXXVII. And be it enacted, That wheat and pork be received in discharge of the tax imposed by this act, at any of the following places, to wit: At Leonard-town, in Saint Mary's county; at Chester-town, in Kent county; at Elk-ridge Landing, in Anne-Arundel county; at
