toricis and pay, for every foot fronting his posterior to a greated to be C if A &. paved, the lum of one thilling; and that the fail special committioners thad make, amend and repair the tame, out of the public monies by this act directed to be raised, and thall recover the same of such resident owner, or tenant of such non-resident owner respectively, as the case may require, in a summary way, before a magistrate, in the same manner as debts not exceeding five pounds, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

XIII. And be it enacted, That if any person or persons shall, after Penalty on the publication of this act, cast or throw down, out of any cart, wag-throwing gon, or other carriage, any rubbish, dirt, or earth, in any public down rubstreet, lane, or alley, of the town of Baltimore, save only in such parts and places as shall be appointed and agreed on by the said special commissioners, every such offender shall forfeit and pay, for every such offence, the sum of five shillings, and pay the costs of removing the same; and if any person or persons, save the said special commissioners, shall hereaster remove or pull down any bar, chain, rope, or fence, which the said special commissioners shall hereaster cause to be set up, in or across the said streets, lanes, or alleys, for the preservation of the pavement then newly made, every such person who shall so offend shall forseit and pay the sum of three pounds for every such offence.

XIV. And be it enaued, That if any distiller, soap-boiler, or tal-on distillers, low-chandler, within the said town, shall discharge any foul or nau- &c. discharge second liquor, from any still-house or work-shop, so that such liquor squors, &c. shall pass into or along any of the streets, lanes, and alleys, of said town; or if any soap-boiler or tallow-chandler shall keep, collect, or use, or cause to be kept, collected, or used, in any of the built parts of the town, any stale, putrid, or stinking fat, grease, or other offensive matter; or if any butcher shall keep at or near his saughterhouse any garbage or filth whatsoever, so as to annoy any neighbour, or any person whatsoever, he, she, or they, being thereof convicted before any justice of the peace of the said town, shall forfeit and pay, tor every fuch offence, the sum of thirty-five shillings.

XV. And be it enaued, That if any person or persons shall, after On persons the publication hereof, cast, carry, draw out, or lay, any dead horse carcases on or other dead carcase, or any excrement or filth from vaults, privies, or commens, &c. necessary houses, and shall leave such carcase, carrion, or filth, without burying the same a sufficient depth in the ground, on any part of the commons of said town, on or near any of the streets, lanes, alleys, or highways, within the said town, or district adjoining the town, every person or persons so offending, and convicted thereof before any justice of the peace, shall forfeit and pay, for every such offence, the fum of thirty shillings.

XVI. And be it enaued, That if any person or persons shall, after on throwing the publication hereof, cast or throw any carrion or filth whatsoever, river, &c. or other annoyance or obstruction, into the river in said town, or into the bason, and shall thereof be convicted before any justice of the peace, every such offender shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum of money not exceeding forty shillings, as the said justice shall think reasonable.

XVII. And
