CHAP. which they or either of them may claim right or title; and a lift of all xviii, xix. the debts, either in money or tobacco, to them or either of them due or owing, specifying which of them are sperate and which desperate. and return the faid list into the office of the auditor-general of this state, on or before the first day of August next, to be by the said auditor laid before the general assembly at their next meeting thereafter.

To deliver an account to auditor, &c.

II. And be it enacted, That the said Thomas Contee shall, and he is hereby required to give in, to the auditor of this state, on or before the first day of March next, a full and complete list and account on oath, of all the sums, either in money or tobacco, due from the said William Molleson, or William and Robert Molleson, or either of them, to him the said Thomas Contee, and of all debts and engagements whatfoever, and bills of exchange drawn or endorsed, for which he the said Thomas Contee, as attorney in fact or agent for the said William Molleson, and William and Robert Molleson, or either of them, is answerable or liable on their or either of their accounts; which said list or account shall be by the said auditor also laid before the general assembly at their next meeting thereafter, for their consideration.

To give in accounts directed by a former act,

III. And be it further enacted, That the said Thomas Contee shall return and give in on oath, all and every the accounts directed and required to be by him returned and given by the act to which this is a supplement; and the said Thomas Contee shall, on or before the first day of February next, enter into bond to this state, with good and sufficient security, to be approved by the governor and council, in the penalty of ten thousand pounds, conditioned for the due execution and performance of the powers and authorities given the said Thomas Contee by this act, as well as by the faid original act.

An ACT for the relief of the family of William Edmiston.

Preamble.

HEREAS James and Alexander Johnson Edmiston, sons of William Edmiston, and Maria Graham Edmiston, the wife, and Jane Edmiston, the daughter, of the said William Edmiston, merit the attention and favour of the legislature: Therefore,

Land referved, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a tract of land in Baltimore county, called Drunkard's-hall, and another tract of land lying in West-Nottingham, in Cæcil county, lately belonging to William Edmiston, be, and they are hereby reserved to the use of the said James Edmiston and Alexander Johnson Edmiston, two sons of the said William Edmiston, in see simple, as tenants in common.

Dwelling plantation

III. And be it enaued, That the dwelling plantation of the said William Edmiston, with the two tracts of land adjoining thereto, given to Mrs. lying in Baltimore county, be and they are hereby given to the said Maria Graham Edmiston, for and during her natural life, with reversion in see to the said Jane and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten.
