A P. H XXI.

An ACT to make valid a deed of bargain and fale executed by Basil Burgeis, late of Anne-Arundel county, deceased, to Daniel Bowley, of Baltimore county.

Preamble.

THEREAS Daniel Bowley, by his humble petition to this general affembly hath let forth, that a certain Basil Burgess, of Anne-Arundel county, on or about the thirteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty, did bargain and sell to the said Daniel Bowley, all that tract or parcel of land called Addition to Indian Glade, lying in Anne-Arundel county, and containing two hundred and fifty-two acres, in confideration of the sum of three thousand and fifty-five pounds ten shillings current money; that the said Basil Burgess, having been paid the full confideration for the faid land, on the day and year aforesaid, made, executed; and duly acknowledged, a deed of bargain and fale for the said land, and put the said Daniel Bowley in the possession thereof; that the said Basil Burgess, shortly after the execution of the said deed, departed from this state, with intention to settle on the Ohio river, with his family, but was taken fick on his journey and died, and his family hath not fince returned; that the faid deed being missaid was not recorded within the time limited by law, and hath prayed an act may pass to make the said deed valid in law: And it appearing to this general affembly, that the several allegations contained in the said petition are strictly true: Therefore,

Deed to be

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it recorded, &c. shall and may be lawful for the said Daniel Bowley to have the said deed recorded among the land records of Anne-Arundel county, at any time within fix months from the passing this act, and that the same deed, when so recorded, shall be as valid, good and effectual, to every intent and purpose intended thereby, as if it had been enrolled within the time limited by law.

A P. XXII.

An ACT to ascertain the property of the citizens of this state earried off or destroyed by the enemy during the present war.

Preamble.

THEREAS congress have requested, that each state should obtain authentic returns of the slaves and other property which has been carried off or destroyed in the course of the war by the enemy:

Commissionpersons to enquire into property car-ried off, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the ers to appoint commissioners of the tax for the several counties of this state be au thorised and required to appoint one active and discreet person, to make diligent enquiry into all damages done by the enemy to the property of the citizens of this state, within their several and respective counties, either by carrying away flaves, horses, cattle, or other property, or by burning or destroying houses or any other property; and such enquiry shall be made by the oath of the party injured, or of one or more in-
