XII. And be it enaced. That the faid intenuant, before he enters on the execution of his omce, thall give bond before the givernor and kkylil. the council, with two good fecurities, in the fum of twenty inculand rogivebond, pounds current money, with condition for the diligent and faithful per- &c. formance of the several duties required of him by this act; and he shall alto take an oath faithfully and impartially to discharge the trust repoted in him by this act, to the best of his skill and knowledge.

XIII. And be it enaced, That if the said intendant shall resule to Governor act, refign, remove out of the state, or die, in the recess of the general vacancy, &c. affembly, the governor, with the advice of the council, may appoint a fit and proper person to such vacant office, to hold the same until the end of the next fession of the general assembly which shall happen thereaster.

C H A P. XXVIII.

An ACT to settle and pay the civil list, and the other expences or civil government.

HEREAS those who decicate their time, abilities, and Preamble. labour, to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services:

II. Be it enaced, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the Salaries to cifollowing annual salaries shall be allowed to the several officers of civil &c. government, for the current year, to wit: To his excellency the governor, one thousand pounds current money; each of the members of the council, four hundred pounds; the chancellor, if he shall reside at the feat of government, fix hundred pounds; the judges of the general court, each four hundred pounds; the judges of the court of appeals, each two hundred pounds; the judge of the court of admiralty, one hundred and fifty pounds; the treasurer of the western shore, four hundred pounds; the treasurer's deputy, two hundred and fifty pounds; the treasurer's clerk, one hundred pounds; the treasurer of the eastern shore, two hundred and firty pounds; the auditor-general, four hundred pounds; the deputy auditor, one hundred and seventy-five pounds; the clerk of the council, two hundred and fifty pounds; the messenger to the council, one hundred pounds; clerk of the senate, one hundred pounds; clerk of the house of delegates, one hundred pounds; the clerk of the court of appeals, fifty pounds; and the same shall be paid quarterly, at the option of the officer, in current money, by the order of the governor and council on either of the treasurers.

III. And he it enacted, That each delegate to congress from this Allowance to delegates to state shall be allowed the sum of forty shillings current money for every congress, &c. day he shall attend, or be on his journey to or from congress; and the governor and council are requested to sell, from time to time, any specific articles which may be on hand, and transmit to the delegates in congress such sums of money as may be necessary, not exceeding the allowance aforesaid.
